**PUBLIC SCHOOL NEWS**  
**SPRING EXAMS NOW AT PUBLIC SCHOOL**  
Spring examinations are in progress at the school. Reports will be distributed on May 1st. Pupils who are weak in certain subjects are advised to put forth greater effort to improve their work before it is too late.

March attendance resulted as follows: Highest percentage, Grade VI, (Miss Wilma Stull's class), 92.57 per cent, second highest KP (Mrs. Jean Dwyer's class) 91.49 per cent. The average for the school was 88.73 per cent. With finer weather and less illness April attendance should be unusually perfect, and later at a minimum.

Several weeks ago a campaign was carried on to raise funds for the March of Dimes. \$386.62 was contributed. Later it became known to us officially that the only society authorized to collect from schools was the Red Cross, so after a group discussion it was decided to send the above amount to that authorized organization. It is hoped that this decision will meet with the approval of the parents whose children contributed.
