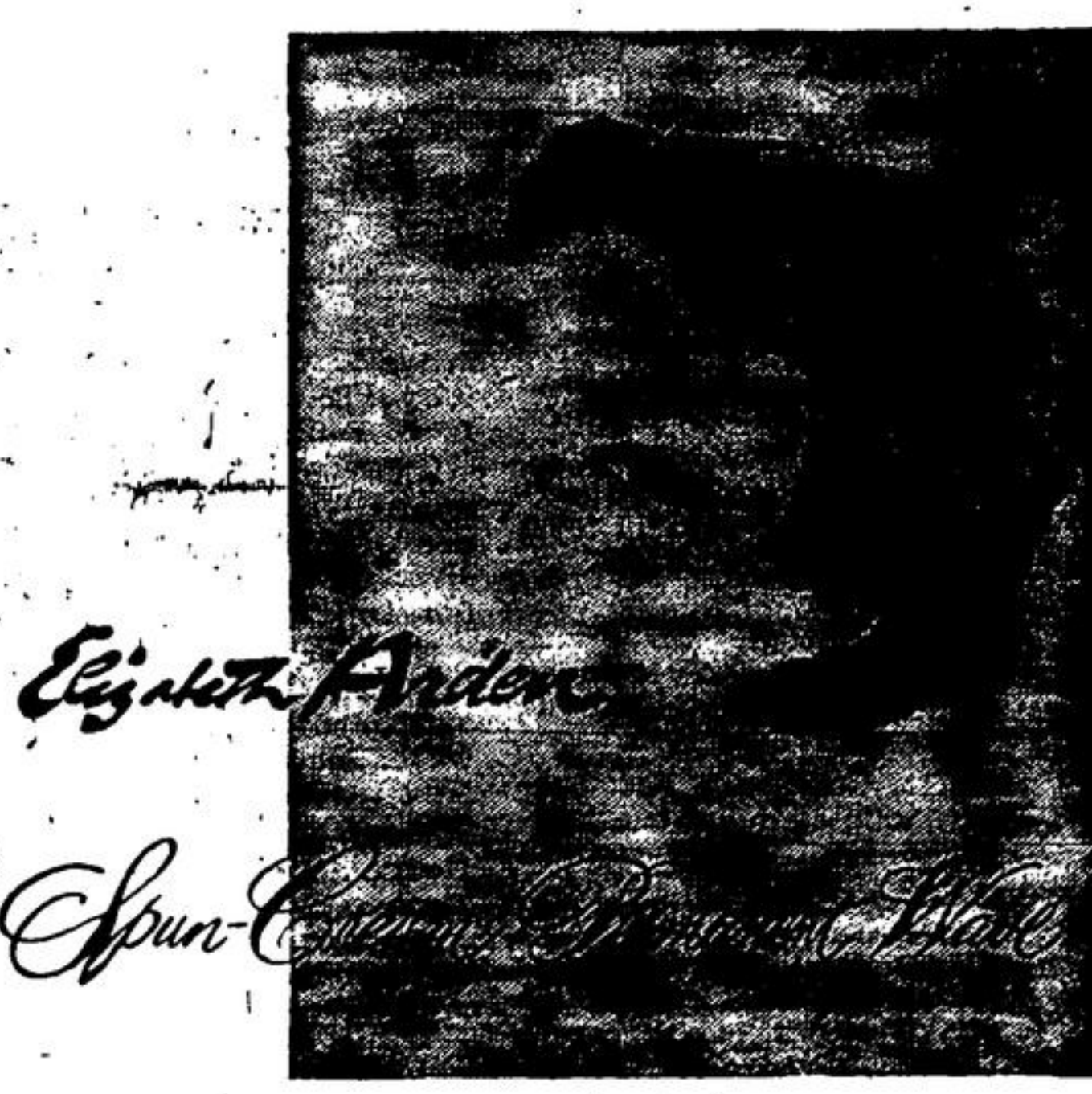

Winners this year will have the option of a trophy or a cash prize.

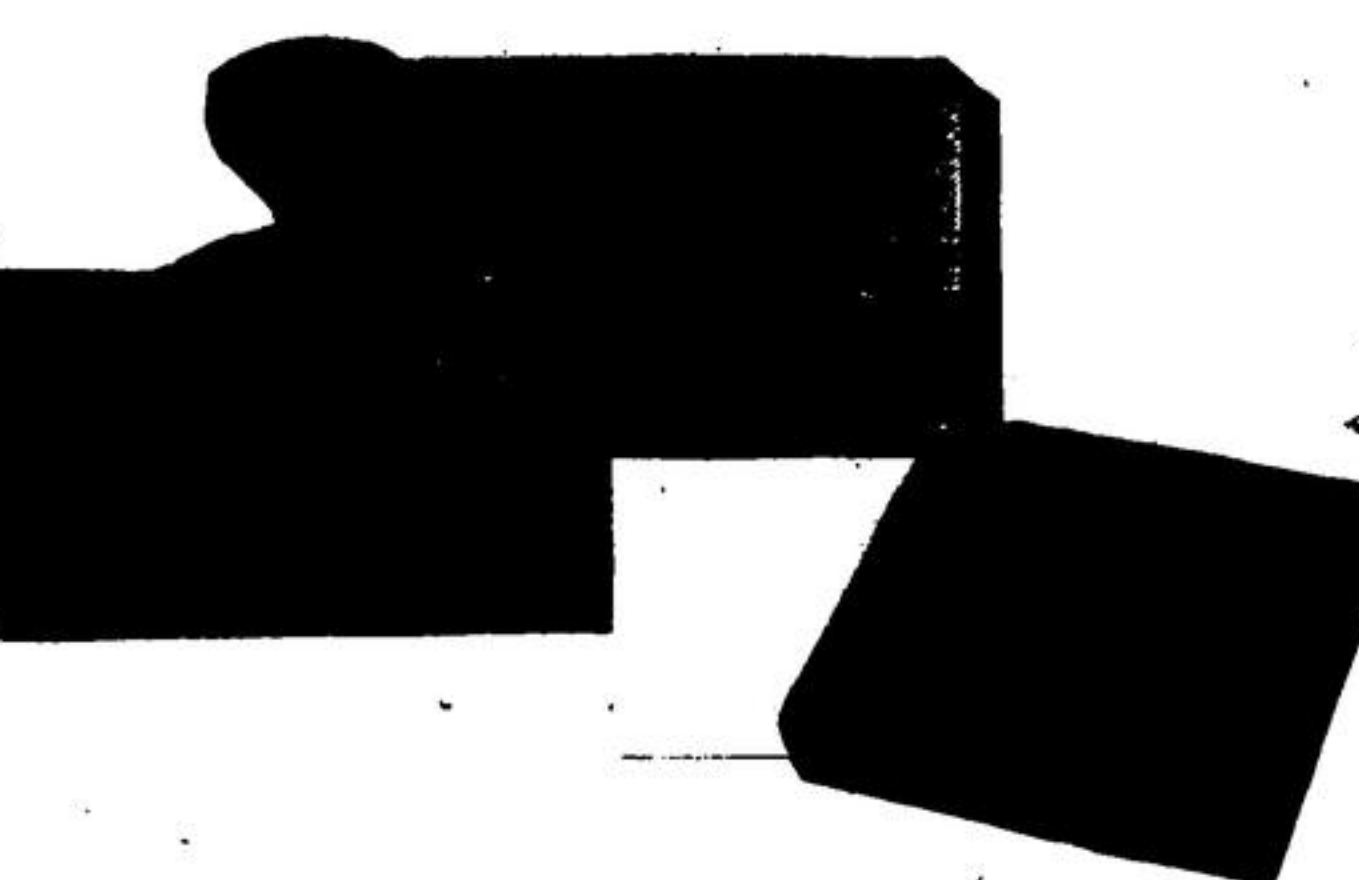
