Halton Anglicans Attend Norval Parish Hall Dinner

The semi-annual dinner meeting of the Halton Deanery Laymen's Association was held on Monday evening, in St. Paul's Parish Hall, Norval, with a good representation from all the Parishes of the Deanery.

The president of the Association, A. E. Dawson, of Glen Williams acted as chairman. The opening prayers were led by Archdeacon W. G. O. Thompson of Georgetown. During the interval following dinner George Atkins of Bronte led in group singing, and a roll call of representatives from the parishes was conducted by Jack Armstrong, secretary of the organization. Rev. J. D. Maxwell welcomed the guests on behalf of the men of Norval, Stewarttown and Hornby.

The chairman in his opening remarks stressed the need of good public relations in the parishes, suggesting to the men that this matter was one which they could accept as their own individual responsibility. Mr. Dawson, in introducing the guest speaker for the evening, explained that Rev. E. Rigby, as secretary treasurer of the Diocese of Niagara, was not unknown to the men of the Deanery and that the Committee was pleased that he had consented to come.

Mr. Rigby took as his topic "The Parish in relation to the work of the Diocese" and pointed out that through the Diocese the individual Parish was linked with the activity of the whole church throughout the world. Mr. Fred McNally, Rector's Warden of St. George's, Georgetown, thanked the speaker and stated that the gathering appreciated the frankness of Mr. Rigby's address. Following this the ladies of St. Paul's were asked to come in from the kitchen and a hearty vote of thanks was moved by Mr. Thomas Warnes, seconded by Mr. W. F. Bradley, both of Georgetown. Mrs. G. Sherring and Mrs. S. White, on behalf of the ladies made a fitting reply.

An invitation was extended to the association by Mr. Owen of Burlington to hold the next meeting, which is to be on October 22, at St. Luke's Church, Burlington. This was unanimously accepted. It was further decided that the deanery rally, so successful last year, be held again on July 8th. A discussion took place on the possibility of holding a Choral Festival for the Choirs of the Deanery. It was decided to leave this matter in the hands of the executive committee. The meeting closed with the Benediction pronounced by Rev. C. F. Hathorne, Junior Dean of Halton.
