Former Schoolteacher Was Alcoa Historian
Following a brief illness, Mrs. H. H. Clark died suddenly on May 5th at her home, 247 Queen Street, Brampton. The former Charlotte Clarence Ford, she was born near Onondaga, a daughter of the late Andrew Ford and Mary Featherstone, members of two of the pioneer families of the district.

Following her education at Georgetown and Oakville high schools, Mrs. Clark taught at the Stone School on the highway at the Limehouse corner until her marriage in June, 1900, to Hugh Herbert Clark. She went as a bride to lot 20, 3rd line, Chinguacousy, where they sold their farm and moved to Brampton.

Mrs. Clark had always been interested in community welfare and shortly before she took sick she had completed a history of the pioneer days of the Alcoa community, which had been requested by the Presbyterian Church at Alcoa, Scotland. Always active in church work, she taught Sunday School at Mount Pleasant and Home churches. She served as president of the WMS at these churches and at the time of her death was president of the Women's Missionary Society of St. Paul's, Brampton. Mrs. Clark had served continuously on the executive of Dufferin and Peel Presbyterial for a quarter century and was president for three years.

Predeceased by her husband, she is survived by one daughter, Mrs. Alex McKinney (Ida), and three grandchildren, Charlotte Ruth, Mary Elizabeth and Alex Hugh. She leaves three sisters, Mrs. Alred Inglehart (Mary) and Miss Matilda Ford, Burlington and Mrs. Harold Gamble (Ida), Gull Lake, Saskatchewan.

Rev. John McDermid conducted the funeral service at McClure's Funeral Chapel, Brampton, assisted by Rev. Alex Cowan, Norval, and Rev. George Booth of Orangeville, a former schoolmate. Interment was in Hillcrest Cemetery, Norval. The pallbearers were Clarence Lyons, Clarence Ford, Clare Ford, I. J. Heney, Reg Shaw and W. L. McClure, nephews and neighbours of the deceased.
