**CHOIR OF JUNIORS WILL COMPETE WOODSTOCK**

The second annual Junior Farmer Choir concert is scheduled for the Recreation Hall, Fair Grounds, Woodstock, on Saturday, May 26th, at 8:00 p.m. Seven Junior Farmer Choirs are participating from the counties of Middlesex, Oxford, Wentworth, Bruce, Halton, Norfolk and Perth. Each choir is singing three numbers of its own choosing not exceeding ten minutes. We also understand from Dick Course, president of the Halton Choir that each choir is allowed to enter one duet to sing one number, and all choirs will be massed at the close of the concert to sing two selected numbers. Dr. Roy Fenwick will act as critic for the concert and director of the mass choir. It is expected that there will be over 300 voices in the mass choir. It is also anticipated that many Halton music lovers will journey up to Woodstock for this outstanding event.

**Beneke Band Plays Brampton Next Week**

Dance band history will be made next Wednesday when Tex Beneke, one of America's greatest orchestras comes to Brampton Memorial Arena for a one-night stand.

The dance is the first of the summer season on the newly installed terrazzo floor which resembles polished marble. The complete ice surface area will be available for dancing, and for those who wish to sit and enjoy the music there will be a number of excellent seats near the band stand.

The Beneke orchestra is one of the top name bands in the states. Originally the orchestra was under the leadership of the late Glenn Miller, who was killed in a plane crash overseas during the war. Beneke, who was sax player and vocalist, kept the old band together, as well as the smooth Glenn Miller arrangements.

**Award \$34,000 Damages To Acton Man's Widow**

Damages of \$34,000 were awarded Mrs. Rod Ryder and her three children by the Ontario Appeal Court against John Winters, Acton.

Mr. Winters, who opened the door of his parked car, throwing Mr. Ryder from his bicycle under the wheels of a Gray Coach bus was held fully to blame for the accident by the Appeal Court. This upset the finding of a jury which found Gray Coach 90 per cent negligent and assessed Mr. Winters 10 per cent.
