**Four Scottish Juniors Coming to Halton Friday**

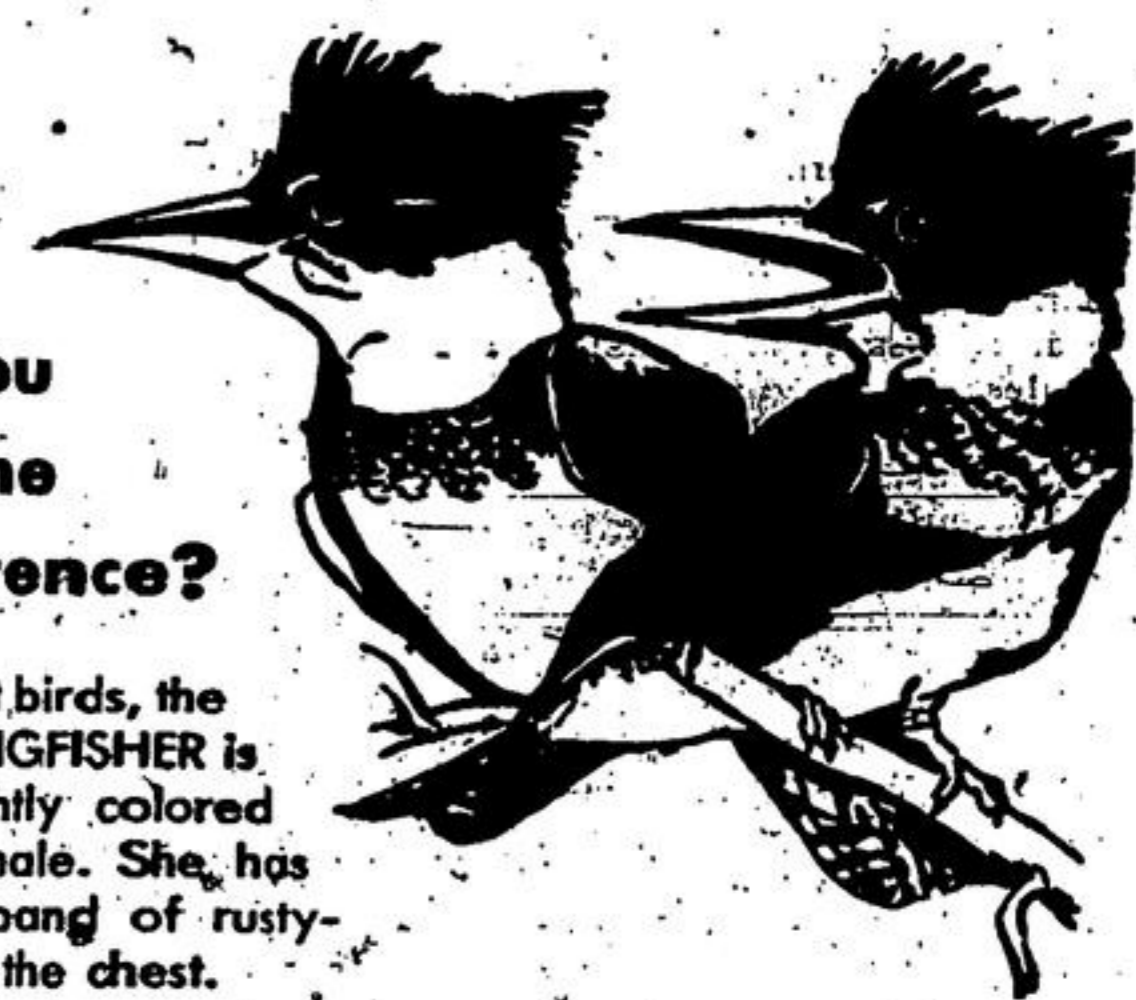

In connection with this event they will visit some six different Halton farms and inspect and judge some of Halton's top Yorkshires, Jerseys, Holsteins, Shorthorns, Clydesdales and Hampshire Sheep. At the same time the two Scottish young ladies will be interested spectators at the Achievement Day of Halton Junior Homemakers, which is being held in the Milton Town Hall. For some years Halton District Women's Institutes have donated a championship trip to the high Junior Home-maker. This year for the first time, a similar trip to the value of \$50.00 is being donated by the Hamilton Spectator, to the high Junior Farmer. This popular annual event always brings a record turnout of Juniors and with the attendance of the Scottish young people as an added feature, it is anticipated many newcomers will be out. An invitation is extended to all Halton rural young people.
