What Council Did

ON MONDAY, JUNE 4th

Endorsed a resolution sent by Kitchener Chamber of Commerce suggesting a route from London to Toronto for the proposed new express highway. The resolution pointed out the necessity of having the highway serve as many towns as possible in the heavily industrialized areas of southern Ontario. The route proposed would bring the highway within a couple of miles of Georgetown.

Appointed Reeve W. G. Marshall and Deputy Reeve Ken MacDonald as delegates to the Ontario Traffic Conference in St. Catharines, June 13th to 15th.

Were notified that the Municipal Board will sit in Georgetown Friday, June 22nd at 10 a.m. for the hearing of Georgetown's appeal against the findings of the arbitrators establishing a new cost sharing of North Halton high school costs. A solicitor will be engaged to act for the town.

to allow stores to stay open all day Thursday, July 12th, because of the Orange parade in Georgetown, and close a half day on Wednesday instead. A petition signed by most of the merchants asked for this.

Will prepare a by-law to construct a sidewalk under the Local Improvement Act on Chapel Street East. A petition was received asking this from H. Derrieks, J. Keir, Mrs. Don Houston and Henry Shepherd.

Received a complaint from Clarence Phillips about improper drainage of a ditch in front of his home on Academy Road.

Were invited by the Legion to participate in the Decoration Day parade a week from Sunday.

Were advised by the Public School Board that they expect to call for tenders early in July for the new school and that tenders should be awarded by the end of July. The board will require about \$100,000 by the end of the year, they expect.

Cr. Lyons remarked that he thought the school board had been extravagant in paying \$9700 for a property when Brampton, a bigger town, had paid only \$8,000 for 8 acres. He thought the purchase should have been arbitrated. Cr. Hill agreed with an article he had read in a newspaper, saying that councils should have more control over school expenditures rather than just footing the bills.

Were advised by county assessor Ford Rogers that a department directive advised that Legion halls be assessed on the proper basis with 25 per cent business tax on the beverage room. A municipal council may alleviate this by partial exemption authorized in the Municipal Act, subject to Municipal Board approval.

The Legion met a ten year tax exemption which expired in 1950 and this year's taxes amount to over \$800. Council felt it only fair that the property be assessed the same as others and did not think Legion members expect any rebate.

Appointed Matt Law as weed inspector at a salary of \$30 yearly.

Rebated \$1400 business tax for 1951 to Clarence Kennedy, because he was not using his house on Guelph Street as a taxi stand, since moving to a new location on Main Street.

Will oil Water Street from the post office to the Harley-Kay-Marsland plant. The company has requested some action for a better road and the oiling will be tried to see if it does the job.

Asked the hydro to put a street light at the stair crossing across the railway in the vicinity of Ernie Rawson's home.

The remainder of the class formed the choir and sang the anthem "I Heard the Voice of Jesus Say" A Tost sang the solo "Though Your Sins be as Scarlet".

It was announced that the annual Flower and Children's Service would be held at St. John's on Sunday, June 17th.
