WE developed a crippling inferiority complex due to an extended week-end visit to the Toronto Highland Games at the CNE Stadium (June 15-16). Standing less than six feet ourselves, we crept around among towering Scottish athletes like an apologetic mantis and watched them putting the shot, throwing hammers and running like wild men around the quarter-mile race track. We felt much better while watching the lassies in the Highland dancing, for they, at least, resembled the traditional Scotland of song and story. From our point of view the Highland Games were a terrifying success.

#### Games' History

The Toronto Highland Games were inaugurated in 1950. With the Toronto Scottish and the 48th Highlanders regiments as a nucleus, it was decided that the Games be dedicated to "establishing and retaining true Scottish traditions and culture in the City of Toronto" and no less than 17 Scottish societies stepped in to boost the event.
