## Stone School Teacher At Grimsby Next Year

Honouring Mrs. Mary E. Laidlaw, who is leaving her teaching position at the Stone School, school pupils and their parents gathered at the home of Mr. and Mrs. Edgar Beeny on the Sixth Line on Thursday afternoon.

Mrs. Laidlaw has taught at the school since the first of this year and has proven her qualities as a teacher and a friend of every child and parent. She has accepted a position in her home town of Grimsby. The pupils, after expressing their regret at losing a good teacher, presented her with a bird book and a book on flowers. Mrs. Laidlaw replied in her usual kind and convincing manner, and said she had liked their school and enjoyed teaching them. Mr. and Mrs. Laidlaw have a lovely home on No. 8 Highway at Grimsby known as the Spinning Wheel.

Miss Marjorie Shaw of Arthur will take charge of the school in September. She graduated from Stratford Normal School in 1946 and had taught at S. S. No. 2, West Garafraxa at the Sand Dam near Ferris since that time.

The Stone School receives its water supply from a spring nearby and is taken about a mile by pipeline into the school. The old mill, the bridge across the river, the water tumbling over the rocks, and the large shade trees made this a desirable spot to sit down after an afternoon's fun, to enjoy chocolate milk, sandwiches and ice cream.
