OLD AGE SECURITY APPLICATION FORMS READY

Application forms for old pensions are now available in all post offices throughout Optario the regional director of old age security, F. C. Jackson, said here today.

Persons who are already receiving Government old age pensions do not have to fill out new application forms, Mr. Jackson emphasized. Their names and addresses are being obtained from provincial recdors and transferred to receral lists without any action being required on their part. Ontario has approximately 91,500 persons in this group. Those who are receiving a \$40.00 a month pension will have it continued at that level; those who are getting a partial pension will find it increased to \$40.

Ontario has betweeen 179,000 and 180,000 persons aged 70 or over not now getting pensions who will be eligible for a pension under the new program, Mr. Jackson said. be checked and all arrangements completed for the first cheques to go out toward the end of January.

Delay in sending in an application may mean that the application cannot be put through in time for the January cheque issue. The longer the delay the less chance there that the application will be handled in time.

Applicants must prove their age, and the proof should be sent along with the application form. Birth or baptismal certificates are best evidence. Other documents that will be considered include records in the family Bibles, church rolls or registers, marriage records, communion gertificates and acknowledgements by insurance companies.

"If you cannot send evidence of this kind, please send any documents you do have that support your claim of age", Mr. Jackson said. "These documents will, of course, ag and residence in Canada may send in your application anyway,

to students of

North Halton High School District

The schools at Georgetown, Milton and Acton, operating under North Halton High School District offer courses in the following:

SPECIAL COMMERCIAL

A one year course, equivalent to that offered in any Canadan business college, available to students who have completed Grade XI. Subjects: Shorthand, typing, office practice, bookkeeping, business law, penmanship, business arithmetic, business correspondence and spelling, economics, phyical education.

ACADEMIC LOWER SCHOOL

Grades IX and X, leading to Intermediate Certificate. Obligatory subjects: English, social studies, mathematics, guidance,

physical education. Plus any 3 of these options: General science, French, Art and Music shop work, home economics, typewriting and business practice.

ACADEMIC MIDDLE SCHOOL

Grades XI and XII, leading to Secondary School Graduation diploma Obligatory subjects: English, history, physical education. Plus any 3, 4 or 5 of the following options: Mathematics, science, French, Latin, German, commercial work, agriculture, shop work, home

ACADEMIC UPPER SCHOOL

Grade XIII, leading to Honour Matriculation and entrance to all faculties and courses except Honour Classics in any Canadian university.

Subjects: English, history, algebra, geometry, trigonometry, zoology, physics, chemistry, Latin, French, German.

SEND YOUR CHILDREN TO HIGH SCHOOL

Give them this wonderful opportunity which is provided free of charge to everyone. Transportation is provided for rural students;" as well as transportation between schools for special subjects Parents and pupils should confer with their nearest principal prior to school opening in September.

Grade XI and XII students who plan to take the Special Commercial course at Georgetown High School should send their names and addresses to the Secretary. If a student lives in Esquesing or Nassagaweya Township, supply the name of your bus driver also; so that arrangements may be made for transportation.
