Congratulations to Mr. and Mrs. Lorne Norton (nee Lois Mills) who were married Saturday.

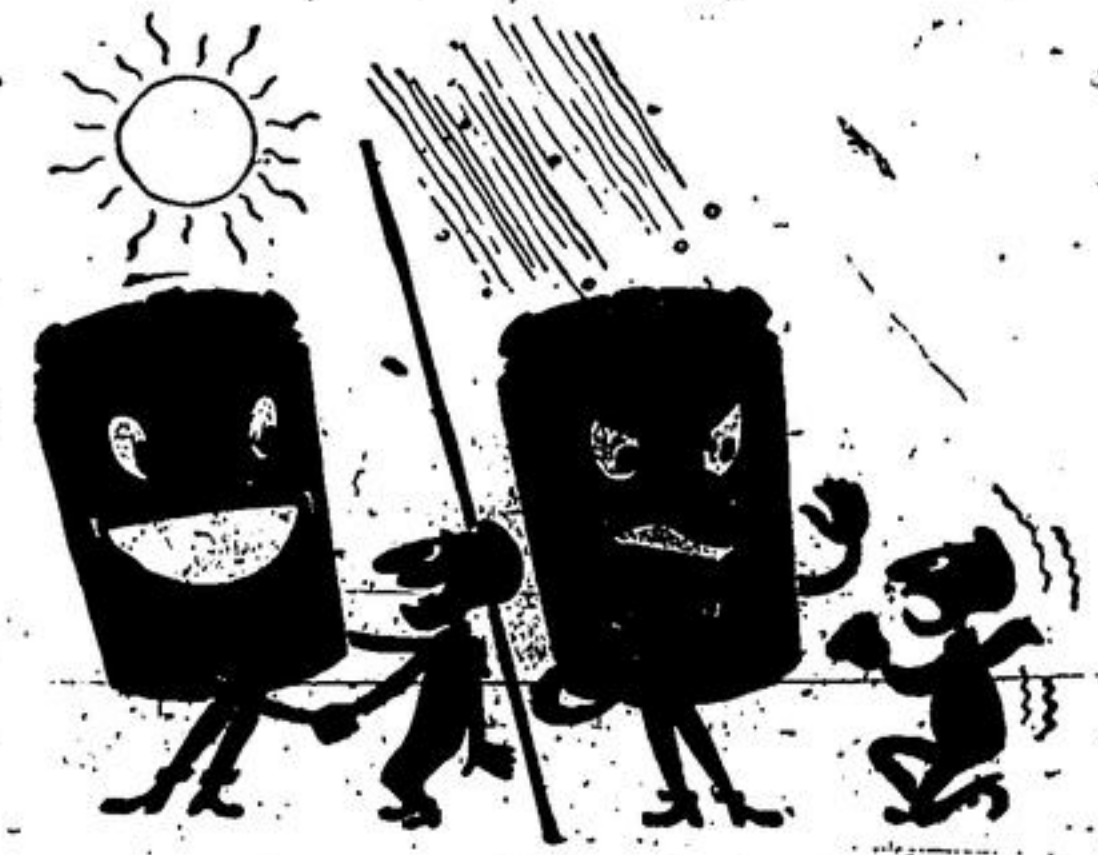
Miss Anna Marie Spitzer is on holidays near Parry Sound.

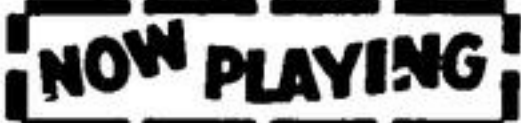
