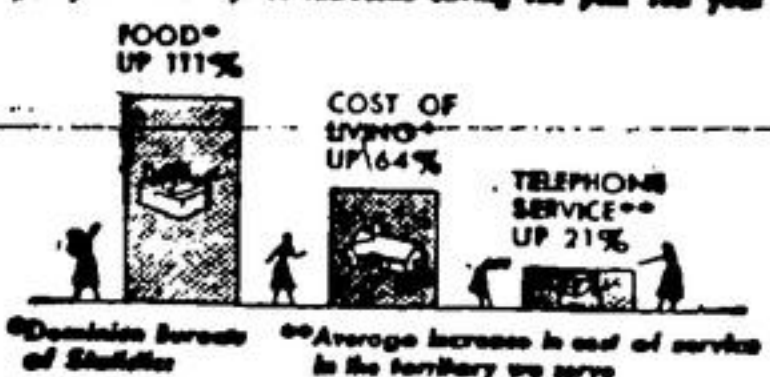

Son of Mr. W. G. Gollop of Norval, George E. Gollop completed thirty years with Canadian Industries Limited on July 1st.

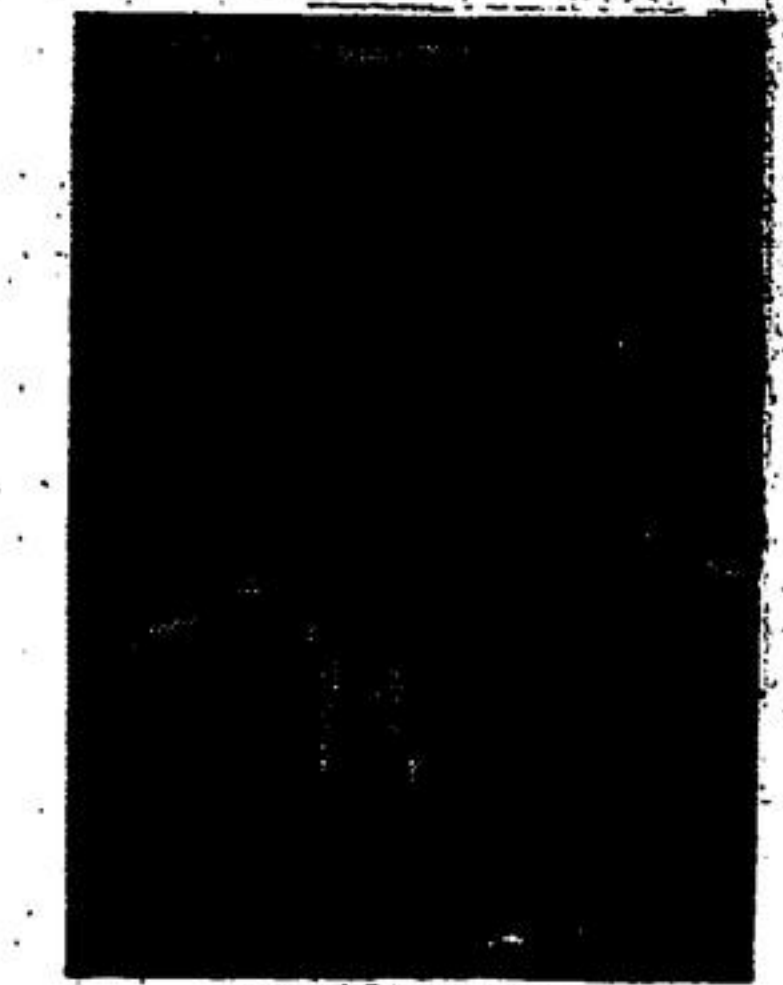
Mr. Gollop was born in Toronto, received his earlier education at North Bend, Nebraska and returned to Canada to attend the University of Toronto where he obtained a B.A. degree (Chemistry and Mineralogy) in 1912.

Prior to joining the Canadian Salt Company in 1921 he was employed by the Pennsylvania Salt Manufacturing Company at Wyandotte, Michigan and Philadelphia, Pa., for seven years.

Of his thirty years service with C-I-L, Mr. Gollop spent twelve in Windsor, one and a half in Toronto and the balance in Montreal head office. In Windsor and Toronto he was sales manager for salt and since going to Montreal he has held various managerial positions in chemicals, served as foreign relations committee secretary and was appointed to his present position in May of this year.

Mr. Gollop has a wide circle of friends in the chemical industry in Canada and the States. Previous to an illness two years ago, he was active in several organizations. He was chairman of the Montreal section of the Society of the Chemical Industry, elected a Fellow of the Chemical Institute of Canada, president of the Montreal Branch of the University of Toronto Alumni organization and vice president of the Chemical Market Research Association (U.S.A.) He was the first

Canadian member of this Association. He is also a member of the Engineers' club of Montreal and of the Commercial Development Association (U.S.A.) For many years he has been a member of the Marlborough Golf Club and the Montreal Masonic Choir.

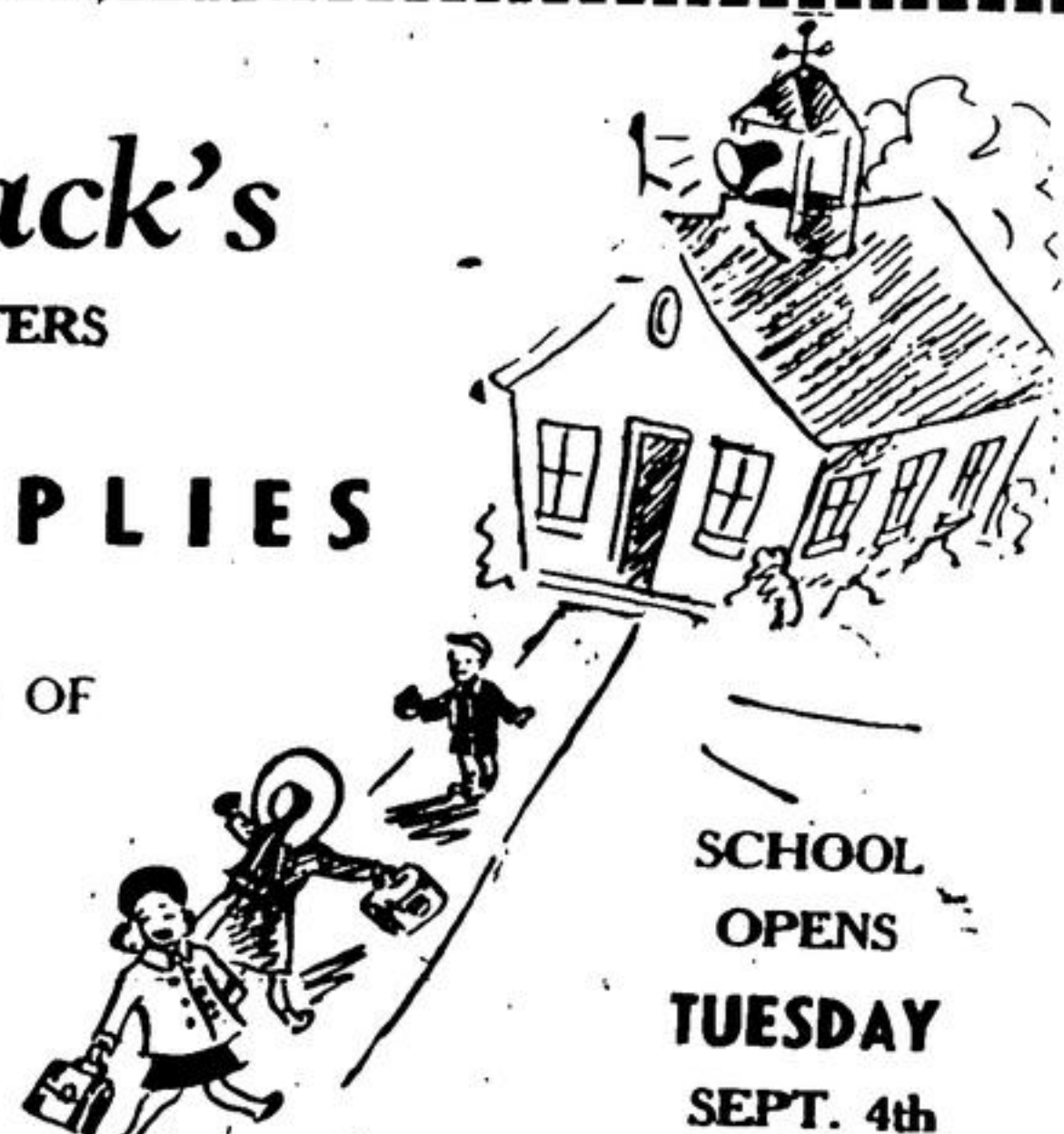
