Badly burned when he touched a hydro cable at the hydro sub-station last Wednesday, 4-year-old Terry Kennedy is making good progress in Sick Children's Hospital, Toronto.

Doctors tell his parents that there is every hope of saving his hand, which took the worst share of the burn.
