Announce Open Seasons For Birds, Small Animals

The open seasons and bag limits for upland game birds and small animals-for 1951 in Ontario have been announced by Harold R. Scott. Minister, Ontario Department of Lands and Forests. The seasons forthe various species and the areas in which they may be hunted are

as follows: Hungarian Partridge: September 17th to October 8, inclusive in any part' of Ontario. Limit of-Catch: 6

per day. Possession Limit: 12. Grouse: Ptarmigan, Ruffed-grouse, Sharp-tailed grouse, Spruce partridge: October 25. 26, 27. and 31st; the Counties of Brant, Halton, Norfolk. Oxford, Peel, Perth. Waterloo and York; the Townships of Darlington (Durham): East Whitby, Pickering and Whitby (Ontario); Adjala. Tecumseh and West Gwillimbury (Simcoe): Puslinch (Wellington); Beverly, East Flamborough and West Flamborough (Wentworth). Limit of Catch: 3 per day.

No open season: The counties of Elgin, Essex. Haldimand, Kent, Lambton, Lincoln, Middlesex, and Welland: the Townships of Ancaster, Barton, Binbrook, Glanford, and Saltfleet (Wentworth).


