AT ESQUESING COUNCIL
ON MONDAY, OCTOBER 1st

The tender of George W. Hamilton for cutting a hill and making fill on concession 10, lot 19 for \$1875 was accepted and a previous resolution, accepting the tender of D. A. Wendover was rescinded.

A fire area, composed of a portion of the township around Milton was created by by-law.

The road superintendent will call for tenders for snow plowing for the winter.

Council will purchase a J. D. Adams motor grader, subject to approval of the highways dept. and Municipal Board.

A \$5 fox claim was paid to Norman Douglas, Acton. Sheep claims totalled \$371.50, composed as follows. H. E. Batkin, 2 lambs killed, \$52; Walter Lawson, 3 sheep killed, sheep and lamb injured, \$105; Robert Miller, sheep destroyed \$40; Dr. H. A. McCullough, lamb killed, \$25; Harding Price, purebred lamb killed \$40; J. A. Willoughby, sheep killed \$35; George Currie, lamb killed, \$42.50; valuator fees total \$32 to Spencer Wilson, A. N. Stark.

The Municipal Board and treasury department have given approval to the tile drainage law. It was announced.

Accounts included. Relief \$48; Roads \$1684; R. W. Cunningham, Clarence Anderson, Harry Bessey, fenceviewing fees, \$12.

At a special meeting on September 19th, council approved the equalized assessment passed by county council on August 28th. A protest was lodged with the Dept. of Lands & Forests granting an open season for deer in certain southern counties. Council applied for the statutory grant on road expenditures of \$43,342 from January 1st to August 31st.
