**Car Twisted, Bent**  
**At C.P.R. Level Crossing**

A car owned by Verne Kipp of Georgetown was smashed into bits at a week-end Monday night when a C.P.R. flyer hit it and strewn parts of it along, half a mile of track before the engine could be braked to a stop.

The incident occurred about 11:30 p.m. on the level crossing at the intersection of the C.P.R. and West of Milton, backing up the way through the fog. Mr. Kipp's car was reportedly following the ground rails, unable to see the car ahead clearly. One of the rear wheels slipped off the crossing plank and was wedged between the tracks, unable to move.

Mr. Mitchell made an attempt to pull the car off the tracks by attaching a chain but before he was able to do this, the flyer whistled through the crossing, smashing the wedged car, breaking four railroad ties and gouging the other ties as it dragged the twisted wreckage along.

**Founded Milton Industry**  
**P. L. Robertson Dies**

P. L. Robertson, Milton's leading industrialist, died at his home last week. An inventor of note, his invention of the socket-head screw led to the establishment in Milton of the P. L. Robertson Manufacturing Company which gives employment to 300 men and women.

The plant was started forty years ago with ten employees and has shown steady growth. Mr. Robertson was president of the company. A native of Seneca Township, he went to Milton in 1908 after some

time in Hamilton. W. A. Robertson, Toronto, and John W. Robertson never married. He B. Robertson, Albuquerque, New Mexico, is survived by two brothers, Dr. Mexico.
