### Harold Henry Speaker W.I. Education Night

The October meeting of the Georgetown Women's Institute was held at the home of Mrs. George Campbell, George Street, on Wednesday evening, October 3rd, with the 1st vice president, Mrs. Seward Wilson in the chair. The meeting very appropriately opened with a Thanksgiving hymn followed by the Mary Stewart Collect.

The roll call, Ways of Neighbouring was well answered, the best being to follow the Golden Rule — Do unto your neighbor as you would he should do unto you.

A committee was appointed consisting of Mrs. Stanley Gowland, President; Mrs. H. Bailey, Dis. Dir. and Mrs. Wm. T. Sinclair, to interview the Town Council regarding a meeting place for the Institute, as its membership was too large to be accommodated in the average home.

Mrs. W. V. Grant, convener of citizenship and education, introduced the speaker of the evening, Mr. Harold Henry, principal of Georgetown Public School, who chose as his subject — our children, one that is dear to the heart of every member of the W.I. whose motto is "For home and country." Beginning his talk with these words "How we can and are helping our children in the home and at school to be happy, healthy and active citizens of our community, country and world," he said that there was a vast difference between the old and new systems of education. They tried to understand each pupil and bring out his individuality. To make the below average pupil happy and wanted; to keep the clever one from finding school too boring; to praise good effort rather than good work. He asked the parents to cooperate, to be interested in their children and to try to keep them healthy both mentally and physically by seeing that they had the proper food and rest. His talk was greatly enjoyed and very enlightening. His audience felt that the present-day system was a "far cry" from the reading, "ritin", and "rithmetic" method that prevailed in their school days when the word "psychologist" was not connected with anything so common-place as school-teaching.

Miss Marion Hepburn greatly pleased those present by rendering two beautiful solos. Her accompanist was Mrs. James Evans, who also gave a piano solo, "Country Gardens" by request. Miss Hepburn also led in "School Days". The National Anthem closed this part of the meeting.

Lunch was served by the committee; Mrs. Fred McNally, Mrs. Frank Sykes, Mrs. M. Robinson and Mrs. Ern Thompson.

Mrs. H. C. Bailey moved a vote of thanks to the hostess, the speaker, the soloist, the pianist and the lunch committee.
