Twenty six Health Units now function across Ontario as against one when this Government took office.

The Provincial Treasury pays one half the cost of installing rural power lines.

New power developments flood all Ontario with cheap abundant power.

Ontario was the first Province to sign a housing agreement with the Federal Government under the new legislation in 1950.

Ontario has taken the lead in the matter of the St. Lawrence Seaway, and has urged upon a pussy-footing Government at Ottawa that we get on with the job, and urge our American friends to stand aside.

No sales taxes; no personal income tax; no nuisance taxes, the lowest Provincial taxation in all Canada.

All this is on the record. It is not a conglomeration of promises, made without even thinking of what is involved. It is not a vote-catching scheme. It is the story of accomplishments. 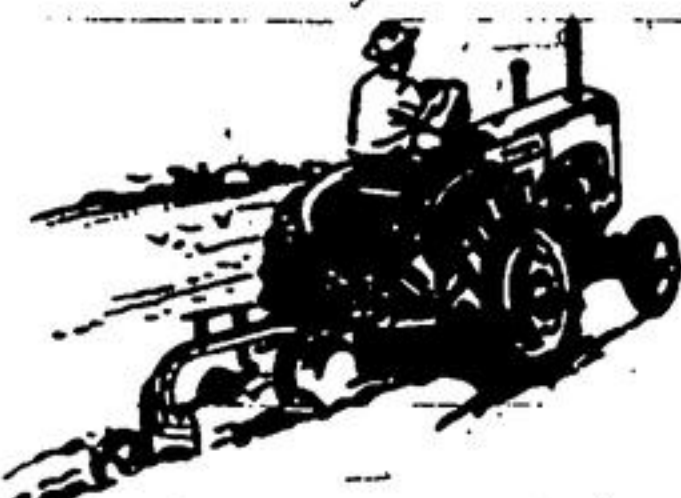
