This breezy American novel chronicles the misadventures of Willie Brown, twenty first ranking U.S.A. amateur tennis player in his attempt to win the national lawn tennis singles. When Willie's backhand was on, his forehand was off and vice-versa. His girl friend Miriam, was tenth-ranking woman's player and no great help to Willie except when she needed moneywhich was frequently. Willie's unquenchable optimism, his penchant for finding trouble, and his complicated love-life will provide an evening's laughs to anyone who has a slight familiarity with tennis

the series "The Glories of the English Cathedrals". The author is Raymond Birt, whose description of this great and ancient church is reverent and understanding, as well as being entirely readable. 
