Two District Girls Music Festival Winners

Two music students from the district were prominent prizewinners at the Kiwanis Music Festival in Guelph last week.

Ruth McBride, a pupil of Mrs. R. H. Wright, won a gold medal for solo piano playing for girls, 15 and under.

Anna Spitzer, Limehouse, was silver medalist in the vocal class for girls 14 and under. She studies with Kenneth R. Harrison.

Mr. Harrison entered several of his piano and vocal students in the festival and good results were obtained by them. Frances Broadfoot, Guelph was third in the 14 and under piano class. Donna McMillan and David Cullen, both of Guelph were given honour certificates when they tied for fourth in this class, and Sylvia Diggins received honours David Cullen also received an honour certificate and Frances Broadfoot had honours in a piano class restricted to residents of Guelph. Merle Mercer, Guelph also received an honour certificate for girl's vocal solo in the 10 and under class.

Other students of Mr. Harrison who received honours were: Arlene Hill, piano 11 and under; Brydon Shields, vocal 10 and under; Sylvia Diggins, piano sonatina, 14 and under; Peter Canham, piano, 10 and under; Donna McMillan, Chopin piano solo; David Diggins, piano 8 and under. David Rawson and Karen Blyth missed honour standing by only one mark in this latter class.

Brampton's Ionic Male Choir, for which Mr. Harrison is accompanist, won the Dr. A. L. Scott challenge shield, scoring a total of 170 points in their two selections. The choir also received a \$25 Kiwanis scholarship.

India Missionary At W.M.S. Rally

A sectional rally of the Halton Presbyterial Woman's Missionary Society was held in St. Paul's United Church, Milton, with Mrs. W. N. Brownridge, Georgetown, presiding. The theme "The World for Christ" dominated the entire meeting, from the opening worship service, to the close. Reports from the auxiliaries about their most interesting meeting, revealed a variety of inspiring, as well as interesting programmes. Mrs. E. B. Clements, Literature Secretary, presented her work in the form of a "Canada Reading Tree" likening the trunk to the Auxiliary books, and so on, down to the leaves, the books for the young children. This was followed by a skit "Muddles and Modells" put on by members of the Milton Auxiliary, showing the right and the wrong way of introducing the missionary magazines to new members.

The afternoon speaker was Miss Dorothy Kilpatrick, a missionary from India, who wore a beautiful blue Indian sari. Miss Kilpatrick spoke first of India's beauty, then contrasted the work done during Britain's oversight of India, with the work being done now. During the transition period, feeling ran high, and missionaries were made to feel they were not wanted. But gradually responsibility was turned over to the Indian Churches, with missionaries becoming "brothers and sisters", instead of "fathers and mothers." And now, the people of India are grateful for their presence and assistance. New India faces tremendous responsibilities, and Miss Kilpatrick asked to pray for Nehru, and the other leaders. She ended her long and interesting talk by asking her listeners to remember all the people of India in their prayers, and to pray that the day may soon come, when there will be just "One Fold, and One Shepherd."
