At the annual meeting of Esqueing Federation of Agriculture, on Thursday evening, November 29th, the guest speaker was Mr. Wm. McCarthy of Shelburne.

Mr. McCarthy spoke on the organization, management, and benefits of the community hospital in Shelburne. This ten bed hospital was financed by community subscriptions, and operates on a cooperative basis. The management is in the hands of a board of citizens who demand the utmost efficiency in the operation.

No grants, or other government financial aid has been received by the hospital, yet with a \$10.00 membership fee, it has been able to give a 20 per cent discount to all members needing hospitalization. This year a 50 per cent discount is planned.

A hospital of this type is only possible where there is the whole-hearted cooperation of the members and the maximum efficiency is practiced.
