Baptist Young People Worship Service Here

The regular morning worship at the Baptist Church was conducted by the pastor, Rev. A. J. Barker, Mr. Barker gave a very inspiring sermon, taking as his text, Isaiah 11:3 — "And shall make him of quick undertaking in the fear of the Lord" which being interpreted into our modern language "And drew his breath in the fear of God." "Send the Light" was the musical selection presented by the Choir.

The evening service was a "Youth Service" when over one hundred Young People representing unions from Acton, Bellfountain, Cheltenham, Hillsburg, and Georgetown gathered together to worship God. A rousing sing song led by Douglas Cole, accompanied by Douglas Peck playing the cornet, Emery Thompson the clarinet, Mrs. R. H. Wright at the organ, Norma Thompson at the piano opened this service. John Winfield read the Scripture Lesson. Mr. Barker laid a great challenge before the congregation "Is Christianity Effeminate?" choosing his text from second Timothy 4:7 — "I have fought a good fight, I have finished my course, I have kept my faith," the words of Paul towards the end of his life. Special music was rendered by the "Friendly Four", the male quartette from Hillsburgh, and also a duet by Miss Faith Towend and Mr. Townend Trafford.

Following the church service a friendly hour was spent in the Sunday School Hall at which the quartette favoured those present with two selections. Everyone joined heartily in the singing of carols and Christmas slides were shown at this gathering. Refreshments were served by members of the B.Y.P.U. at the close of this hour of fellowship.

Brampton Doctor Was Born Hornby District

A medical practitioner in Brampton for more than 40 years, Dr. Robert George Edwards, 77, died Sunday at his home, Queen Street West, from a heart attack.

Dr. Edwards served for eight years as Brampton's town treasurer. For the past ten years he had been semi-retired and lived the greater part of the time at his summer home, Treehaven, Hallburton.

Born at Hornby, Dr. Edwards taught school in the Bethel district before entering university. He graduated in medicine from the University of Toronto in 1908. He was an active member, and former warden of Christ Church of England. He leaves his wife, Gertrude L. Featherston Edwards and one daughter, Mrs. G. Giddings, Lachine, Quebec.

Famous De Paur Chorus Fills Brampton Theatre

The De Paur Infantry Chorus played to an overflow crowd in Brampton's Odeon Theatre last week. It was the first in a series of Community Concerts.

The chorus had its birth when Leonard De Paur, a talented musician, became director of an army glee club in a negro National Guard outfit. After the war, four of the original members decided to continue as a professional choir and this year it has become one of the top musical outfits in America. Their biggest current hit is "Sound Off", adapted from an old army song known as the Duckworth Chant. The song made the Hit Parade, and has now been adopted as a theme song by the Chesterfield tobacco firm.
