New Books At the Library
MR. BLESSINGTON'S PLOT
 by John Sherwood
JUDGMENT ON DELTICHEV
 by Eric Ambler

Both of the above books have their settings in countries behind the Iron Curtain and both make capital of the secret police and party organizations of Soviet-dominated country. There are spies and counter-spies, plots in the dark and corpses in plenty left lying all over the place. But there the superficial resemblance ends. The latest Eric Ambler book makes a serious attempt to depict the background and purpose of political trials such as that of Cardinal Mindszenty and the American businessman Coates. Those who like Eric Ambler, and their name is legion, will applaud his latest effort. Others may find it a trifle pretentious and at times unconvincing.

Mr. Sherwood's book on the other hand canters light-heartedly thru a maze of murders, hair-breadth escapes and has a beautiful blonde thrown in for good measure. For those who like their spy stories to be fast, furious and gay this book can be highly recommended.

APPOINTMENT WITH VENUS
 by Jerrard Tickell

This is a convincingly told story of Armored during the days of the German occupation in 1940. Armored, one of the smallest of the Channel Islands, with a population of less than four hundred people, clung to its ancient patois and feudal customs. The attempts of the Germans to win over the Islanders with alternate paternal indulgence and severity is graphically described. The characterization of both Germans and Islanders is very well done. In addition the novel has a fast-moving plot with a surprise twist. Venus is a prize cow about to produce a bull-calf of irreplace-

able breeding. The German military governor, a Westphalian cattle breeder in private life, recognizes the merits of Venus and her impending progeny and arranges to have the super cow transferred to the safety of Hitler's Reich. In the nick of time M.I. 5 (British Intelligence Service to the uninitiated) thwarts the dastardly plot and saves Venus for the empire and democracy. There is a very pretty little romance and a gentle humour that will make this book one of general appeal.

THE DEVIL IN VELVET
 by John Dickson Carr

Here again are two books that at first sight have much in common. Mr. Heard's book frankly proclaims itself to be a novel of the supernatural while Mr. Carr, who is better known as an author of detective stories, has one of his characters early in the book recognize certain resemblances to the medieval story of Dr. Faustus.

Mr. Carr's story opens rapidly with an elderly Cambridge history don making an arrangement with the Devil, which permits him to seek the solution of a 17th century murder case which has engaged his scholarly attention. For a price the Devil grants his wish and we are plunged into an exciting Restoration blood's life which is filled with three beautiful women, court intrigues and duels aplenty. As long as Mr. Carr is revelling in the lusty everyday life of his colorful swashbuckling bucks and wenches he sweeps the readers along with him. It is when he attempts to solve the implications of his supernatural framework that he is much less convincing.

On the other hand the Black Fox moves slowly along through the minute jealousies and the staid daily life of the Bishop and clergy of a provincial cathedral in England. The characters are realized slowly and pitilessly and the horror of a mediaeval cult of black magic works up to an inescapable but artistic climax. The story centres around a bookish Canon of the Cathedral who sees himself slowly replaced in the Bishop's favour by a younger, more ambitious and shallower character. Half in idleness and half in earnest he resorts to the trial of an ancient Persian formula for invoking supernatural aid against his rival. The formula works, but once the evil spirit has been invoked it cannot be banished except at a terrific price.

However it is the careful analysis of the mental life of its various characters and the searching exposition of their unconscious thoughts that make Mr. Heard's story a much more convincing excursion into the realms of the supernatural.
