#### Main Causes of Farm Fires And How to Prevent Them

Defective chimneys rank high as a cause of farm fires during the butting season. Repair cracks or ther defects and replace rusted or curried out stove pipes as a first step towards preventing a fire

Use a metal of asbestos floor covering under wood for coal burning led in action in Italy, December of toxes. Use double metal ventilated thimbles where stovepipes pass

through frame walls or partitions Another group of farm fires are -tarted by sparks on roofs. A spark arrestor on your chimney will eliminate this risk. This hazard an also be reduced by installing fire-retardant roofing.
