However, of the 3.7 per cent of the quarters infected on December 1st, 2.5 per cent of the quarters belonged to cows which had sither been added to the various herds or were not in milk when the initial test was made in August In other words, of the. 18 per cent of the quarters infected or positive in August, only 1.3 per cent. were still infected. In the mine control herds not treated, 9.4 per cent; of the quarters were positive on the initial test in August and 9.2 percent were positive on the December test. The 2 per cent variation here is no doubt due to cow. changes in the various herds. In short, the incidence of diseased quarters for all practical purposes remained constant in the control group of nine herds -

While the Mustitis Control Programme is optional with the 78 members in the three Halton DHIA Groups, it is difficult to conceive that there will be many who will not avail themselves of the oppor-
