Serious Drop in Organic Matter in Halton Soils

The importance of organic mat-

ter or humus in soils is generally

recognized. It is the opinion of many that the greatest limiting factor or weakness in Halton's soil is the lack of humus. When glandingthrough the report of the Halton Crop Improvement Association, which covers its programme for the past twelve months, we came across a section pertaining to organic matter. In order to determine to whate extent our soils have been depleled of this important material which is sometimed referred, to as the 'Life of the Soil' we noted that soil samples had been taken from a number of cultivated fields and also from the adjoining fence rows. These soil samples were taken to the Solls Department at the Ontario Agricultural College, where a comprehensive study and analysis had been made of the organic matter content. In analysing the results it had been assumed that the samples from the fence rows were nearest to normal. Frankly we were sturtled to note that (1) in all cases the organic matter content of the dultivated fields was lower than that of the adjoining fence rows; (2) that this decrease ranged all the way from 20 per cent to 85 per cent with an average percentage decrease of 38.2 per cent. We were informed that-the-samples had been taken from better than average farms farms from which the present operators, at least, do not sell manure farms on which are carried a good-19 number of livestock and on which an effort is made to have a good rotation. If this is the sitution on some of our good farms, what must be organic matter level on those farms where the bulk of the farmyard manure is sold annually - where little livestock is carried and where most of the farm revenue comes from the sale of the grain, hay and straw. If we are to increase water holding capacity of our soils - reduce the draft power required at the draw bar - extend the period when our heavier soils can safely be worked in the spring and also pave the way for bigger crops of more highly nutritious feed for our live stock, then we must



not only give serious thought to

organic matter level but take action.
