## Raiders Second in Hockey Standing

Beating Elmira 9-6 on Friday in Elmira, Raiders took over second place in the group standing. It was a thrill-packed game played before over 1200 spectators, which went into overtime. Harvey Chappel continued his scoring spurge to ring up three goals, the Beaumont brothers each got two, and the Bradbury brothers one apiece. Bridgeport strengthened their hold on first place last night when they defeated the locals here 6-2 in a game which wasn't outstanding in any department.

Georgetown now has a one-point edge over Elmira and Walkerton, the other two teams in the "B" group, who both have 11 points. Bridgeport, who are "A" category have won 9 out of their 14 games to lead the league.

Plans for three imports from the Hespeler team which folded early in the season were quashed by the OHA last week. Raiders had been dickering for Stoddart, Dyer and Dutch Elmira also had their eye on some Hespeler players, but no dice. Raiders have been bolstered, however by an old-timer "Dude" Lindsay. Out of action for three years, defenceman Dude was a member of the Georgetown team in the early war years, then played hockey for Acton.
