It will be recalled that the Brain herd sire had the following show record for 1951: second and Reserve Junior champion at the CNE Junior and Reserve Grand Champion at Halton B and W Day second at the Royal Winter Fair. Our heartfelt congratulations are extended to the Brain family and in particular to son Bill, who was largely responsible for the fitting and showing of the animal in question.

## O.A. Trudeau Succeeds A. A. Gardiner As Head of C.N.R. Passenger Traffic

Oswald A. Trudeau will succeed A. A. Gardiner as C.N.R. general passenger-traffic manager when Mr. Gardiner retires on pension Dec. 23. John Pullen, vice-president in charge of traffic, also has announced that General Passenger Agents Arthur P. Lait of New York and F. N. McKenzie of Winnipeg will come to headquarters as passenger traffic managers. Joseph N. Vincent of Montreal was named assistant passenger traffic manager here.

Mr. Trudeau has had 45 years of passenger traffic experience. He is widely known as an historian and for charitable and social work, and is president of St. Lawrence Island Club.

Mr. McKenzie was born at Morven, Man., in 1900 and began his railway career in the passenger department of Saskatchewan in 1917. An enthusiastic currier, he has been associated many years with travel arrangements for Macdonald-Brian Bonspiel.

Mr. Lait was born at Winnipeg in 1897, and joined the operating department of the railways in 1915. He transferred to the passenger branch in 1918. He served in the First Great War and was awarded the Military Medal. In the Second World War he was in charge of company's office in Washington, D.C. Mr. Vincent was born in 1901 and joined the C.N.R. in 1921.
