NEW BOOKS AT THE LIBRARY

A HISTORY OF CANADA
 by Jean Bruchesi (358 pp.)
 translated from the French by R. W. Robertson

This is a very readable book and one which is sure to provoke discussion among English speaking Canadians. Mr. Bruchesi has very pointedly expressed the attitude of most of the 32 per cent of our fellow-Canadians whose native tongue is French, and to a lesser extent the 45 per cent who belong to the Roman Catholic Church.

Almost one third of the book deals with New France before the treaty of Paris. There is no doubt that this part of the book is both fascinating and illuminating in its presentation of a French Catholic Society which in its stress on morality was almost morbidly Puritan. The last part of the book attempts an appraisal of Canada's political, economic and intellectual life. The emphasis may well be realized from the brief section on Canadian composers which lists 24 unmistakably French names and two others that may be French. Sir Ernest MacMillan is apparently the only English-speaking composer in Canada and he is mentioned because of the use he makes of the folk songs of New France. It should not be imagined, however, that the book is entirely negative in its attitude to that part of Canada lying outside Quebec. Mr. Bruchesi has some ideas which he obviously hopes will be noticed beyond the bounds of his native province. He labours the point that Canada is an American country and that only its French-speaking population is thoroughly American in its outlook. And as Americans he insists that they were right in regarding past wars in Europe or Africa or Asia as a real concern of theirs. He makes it plain, however, that the coming of the present airplane development is rapidly forcing a change of ideas on this subject. He is also quite critical of the looseness of the B.N.A. Act of 1867 which guarantees separate educational facilities to the English Protestant minority in Quebec, but failed to safeguard similar rights for French-Catholic minorities in the other provinces. On the other hand Professor Bruchesi quite readily admits that Quebec owes much if not all to its British connections and states bluntly that annexation to the U.S.A. would be a shroud of all French Canadian hopes and of its culture.

SUGAR ON THE SLATE
 by Don Fontaine

This is a rather hilarious novel about an adventure in progressive education at the Peyton Junior High School. In view of the present controversies raging in Ontario about progressive education this book is rather timely. The author is, or at least was, a teacher. We doubt he could continue to face his principal and staff colleagues after publication.

Mr. Burkhardt, the principal of Peyton Junior High School came back from a summer course with some ideas about making education live. After an initial but accidental success when the Latin students wear togas and stage a realistic gladiatorial contest and a visit to a farm where artificial insemination was practiced and half explained, Mr. Burkhardt got the brainwave of having the school take over the city government for a day. Some anti-social and reactionary ends secretly acquainted the young brats of the old unrepealed even unknown by-laws of 1850. What happened when the kids, armed with their secret knowledge, took over the city should keep the reader in kinks for an hour or so.

HOW TO GET FROM JANUARY TO DECEMBER
 by Will Cuny, author of the Decline & Fall of Practically Everybody.

A book of American humour, mildly reminiscent of the late Robert Benchley. It follows the plan of an old-fashioned almanac and specializes in handing out irrelevant and misleading information.

NO REST FOR BOTTS
 by W. H. Upton

This is the most recent in the long series of adventures of Alexander Botts, supersoldierman of Earthworm Tractors. Mr. Botts is as lively and lucky as usual and as improbable.

SCIROCCO
 by Romaldo Romano

translated from the Italian A Hemingway Prize Novel
 This short graphic story follows the Hemingway pattern of almost brutal realism and apparent aimlessness. The setting is a small town in Sicily in the early year of World War II. Stolid peasant endurance of 1918, ignorance and Fascist tyranny is mixed with occasional lighter flashes such as the heron hunt among the mountain rocks. Adult reading.
