## NEW BOOKS THE LIBRARY

A HISTORY OF CANADA by Jean Bruchesi (358 pp.)

translated from the French by R. W. Robertson

This is a very readable book and one which is sure to provoke discussion among English speaking Canadians. Mr. Bruchesi has very pointedly expressed the attitude of most of the 32 per cent of our fellow-Canadians whose native tongue is French, and to a lesser extent the 45 per cent who belong to the Roman Catholic Church .

Almost one third of the book deals with New France before the treety of Paris. There is no doubt that this part of the book is both fascinating and illuminating in its presentation of a French Catholic Society which in its stress on morality was almost morbidly Puritan.

The last part of the book attempts an appraisal of Canada's political, economic and intellectual life. The emphasis may well be realized from the brief section on Canadian composers which lists 24 unmistakably French names and two others that may be French. Sir Ernest Mac-Millan is apparently the only English-speaking composer in Canada and he is mentioned because of the use he makes of the folk songs of New France. It should not be imagined, however, that the book is entirely negative in its attitude to that part of Canada lying outside Quebec. M. Bruchesi has some idea which he obviously hopes will be noticed beyond the bounds of his native province. He labours the point that Canada is an American country and that only its Frenchspeaking population is thoroughly American in its outolok And as Americans he insists that they were right in regarding past wars in Europe or Africa or Asia as . , eil concern of theirs. He makes it plain, however that the coming of the present airplane development is rapidly forcing a change of ideas on this subject. He is also quite critical of the looseness of the B.N.A. Act of 1867 which guarantees separate educational facilities to the English Protestant minority in Quebec, but failed to safeguard similar rights for French-Catholic minorities in the other provinces. On the other hand Professor Bruchesi quite readily admits that Quebec owes much if not all to its British connections and states bluntly that anpexation to the U.S.A. would be shroud of all French Canadian hopes and of its culture
