Cr. McGillivray suggested that the council consider snow plowing all the sidewalks in town.

Cr. Allen reported that a culvert blocking of which was believed to be causing flooding at Normandy Boulevard was not on public school property. The mayor said he had been told by Jack Tost that the culvert had been cleaned out on Sunday and the condition remedied.
