Halton First To Subsidize Ponds

That Halton County officials are alive to the need for conservation of water is indicated by the action of the Halton County Council at their last session, when they approved of the recommendation of the Halton Conservation Committee to provide a subsidy on farm ponds constructed in 1952 on privately owned property. The Ont. Dept. of Agriculture will contribute to the subsidy on a dollar for dollar basis with the Halton County Council. The policy provides for a subsidy of fifty per cent of the cost up to a maximum of \$100 on any approved pond. In order to qualify for this subsidy, Halton landowners must first apply in person to the Milton Office of the Ontario Dept. of Agriculture. Furthermore, the proposed site must be approved by a representative of the Department of Agricultural Engineering at the Ont. Agricultural College before operations commence and again when the pond is completed. Further details of the policy can be secured at the Agricultural Office in Milton.

Halton is the first county to inaugurate such a policy in Ontario and it marks another forward step in conservation work. It is in keeping with a previous by-law passed by the Halton County Council which provides a subsidy on wood lot fencing—the purpose of which is to keep live stock out of existing

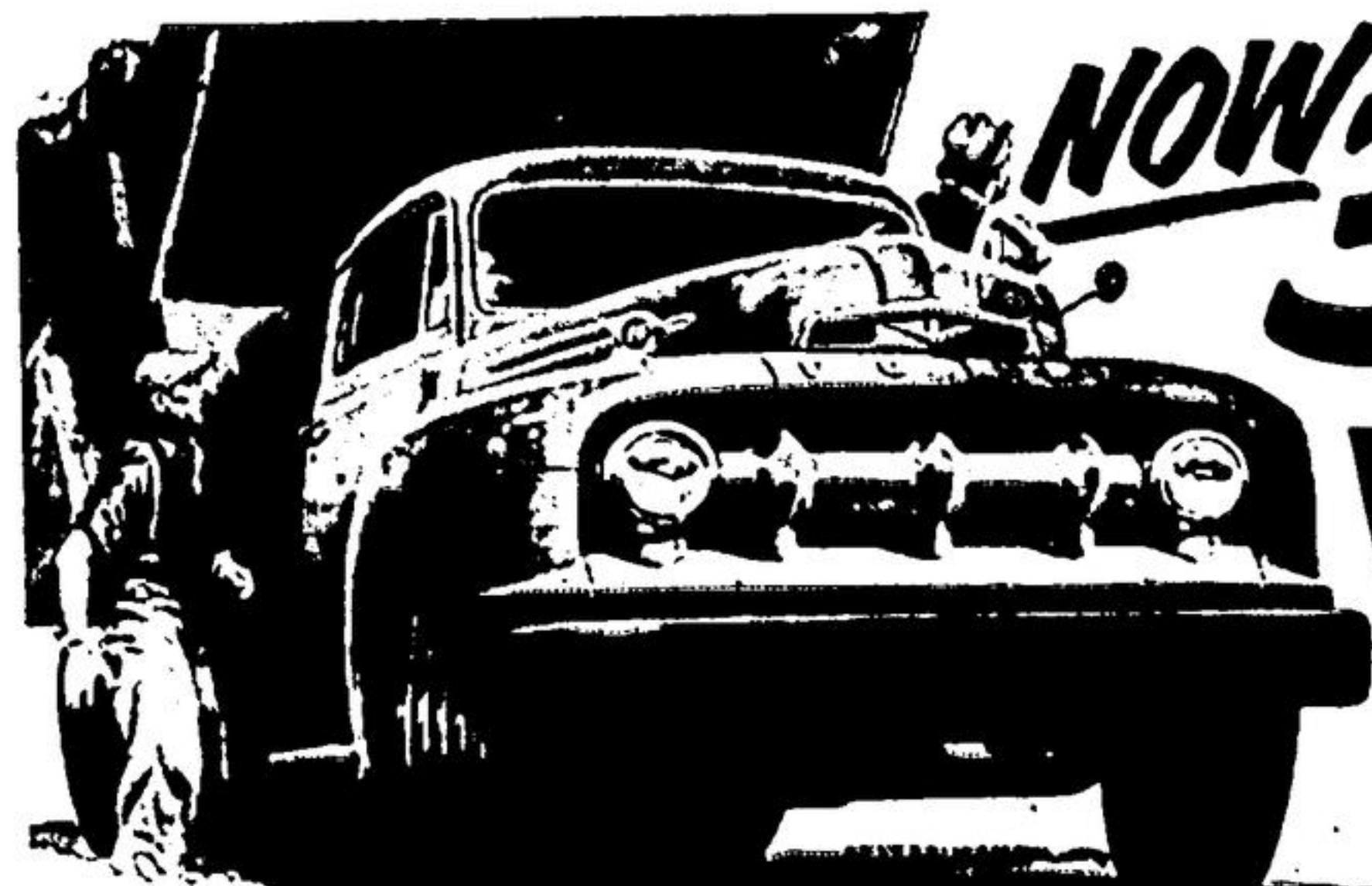
PARTY FOR BRIGDENS SILVER ANNIVERSARY

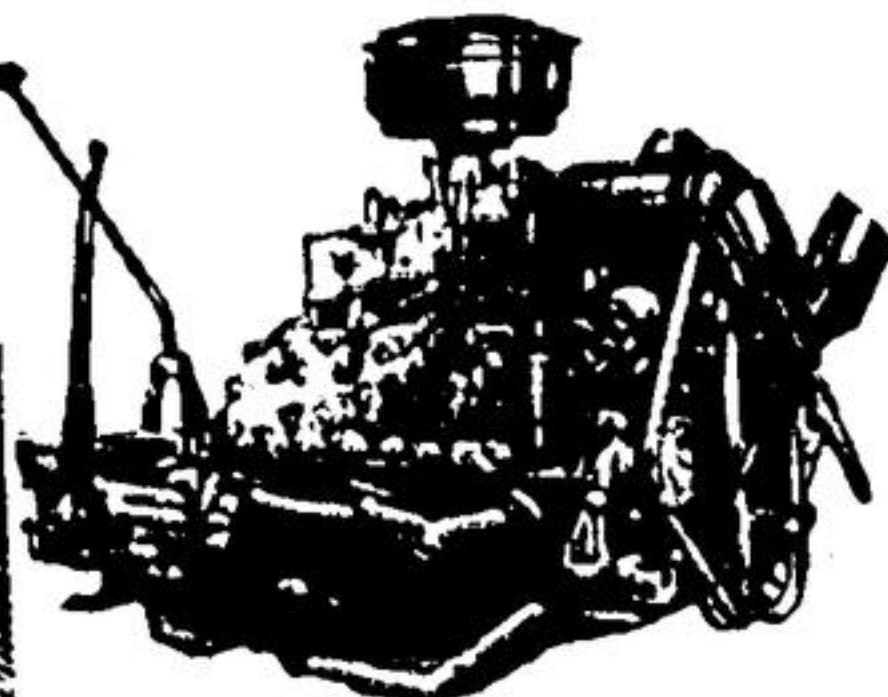

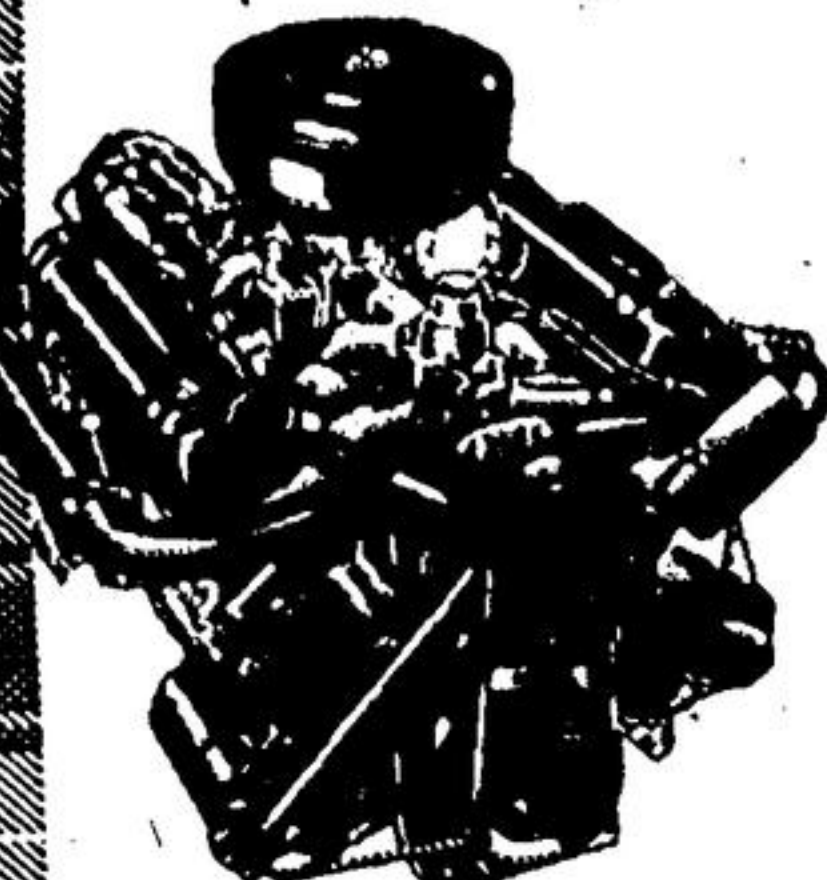
