GLENDOL HOLSTEIN SALE AVERAGE \$281

The Glendol herd of purebred Holsteins owned by W. H. Dolson, Georgetown, was dispersed at the Oakville Sales Arena with 39 head bringing \$10,432 for a general average of \$281.

R. W. Drinkwater, Jarvis, Ont., paid the top price of \$390 for Glendol Ring Apple Grace, an eight year old cow. Drinkwater also paid the second highest price of \$375 for a seven-year-old and her baby calf. The \$375 figure was also reached on the bid of Sam F. McClure who secured a three-year-old heifer, H. Hewson, Mono Road, bought a seven-year-old cow at \$370. J. R. Gilpin, Terra Cotta bought four head for a total of \$1,125.

Twenty five milking females averaged \$314, one bred heifer \$235, 6 open heifers \$218 and 5 heifer calves \$196.

It was interesting to note the large crowd of breeders on hand for this event, the Sales Arena being crowded and standing room at a maximum. Bids came from all sides and the 39 head offered went to no less than 26 different buyers.

Mr. Dolson, who has bought Mr. Joseph Gibbons' Charles Street house is now living in town. He disposed of his other farm goods last week at an auction conducted by Frank Petch.
