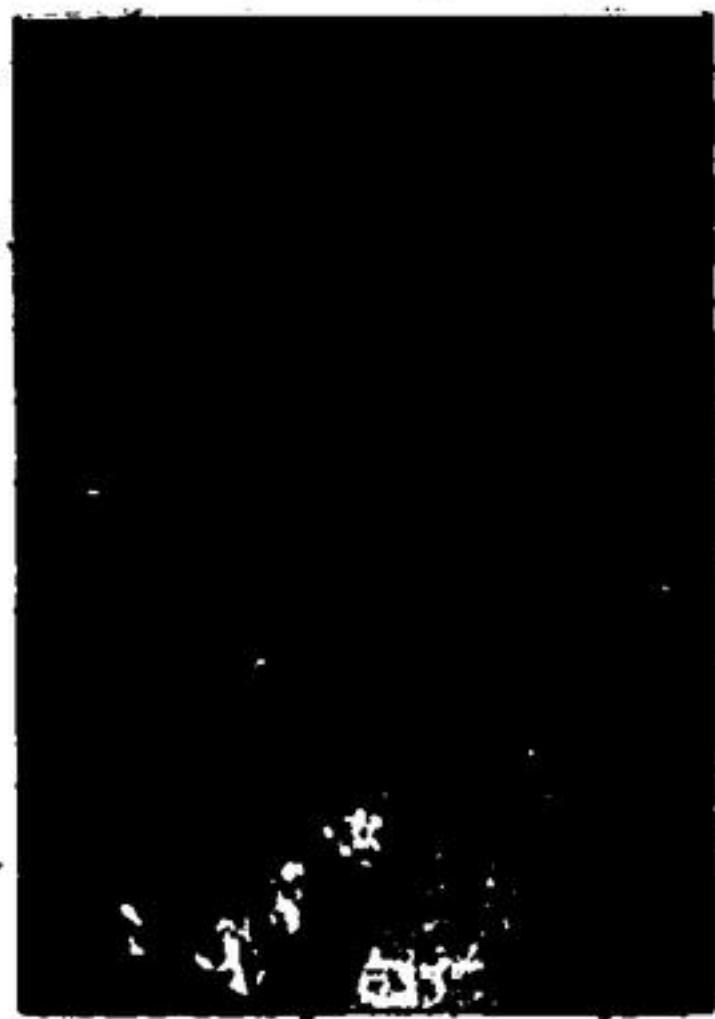


FARM FORUM BANQUET FOR HOCKEY PLAYERS

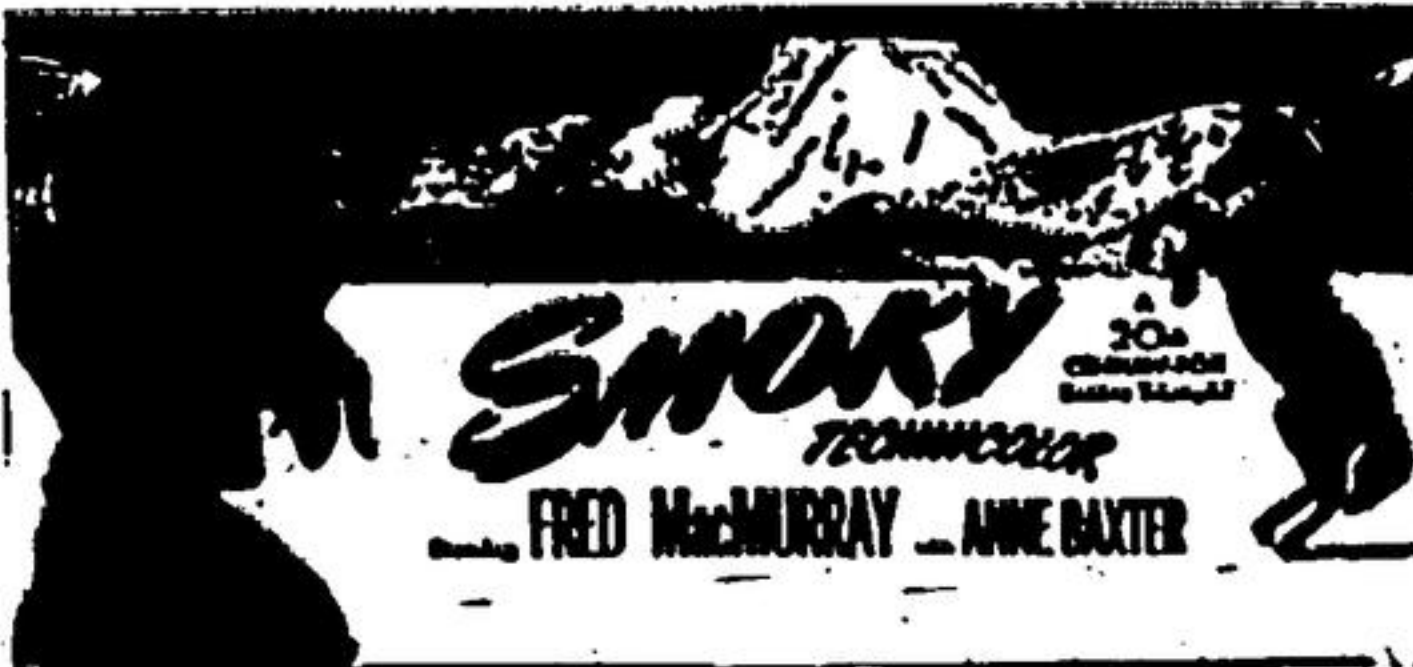
