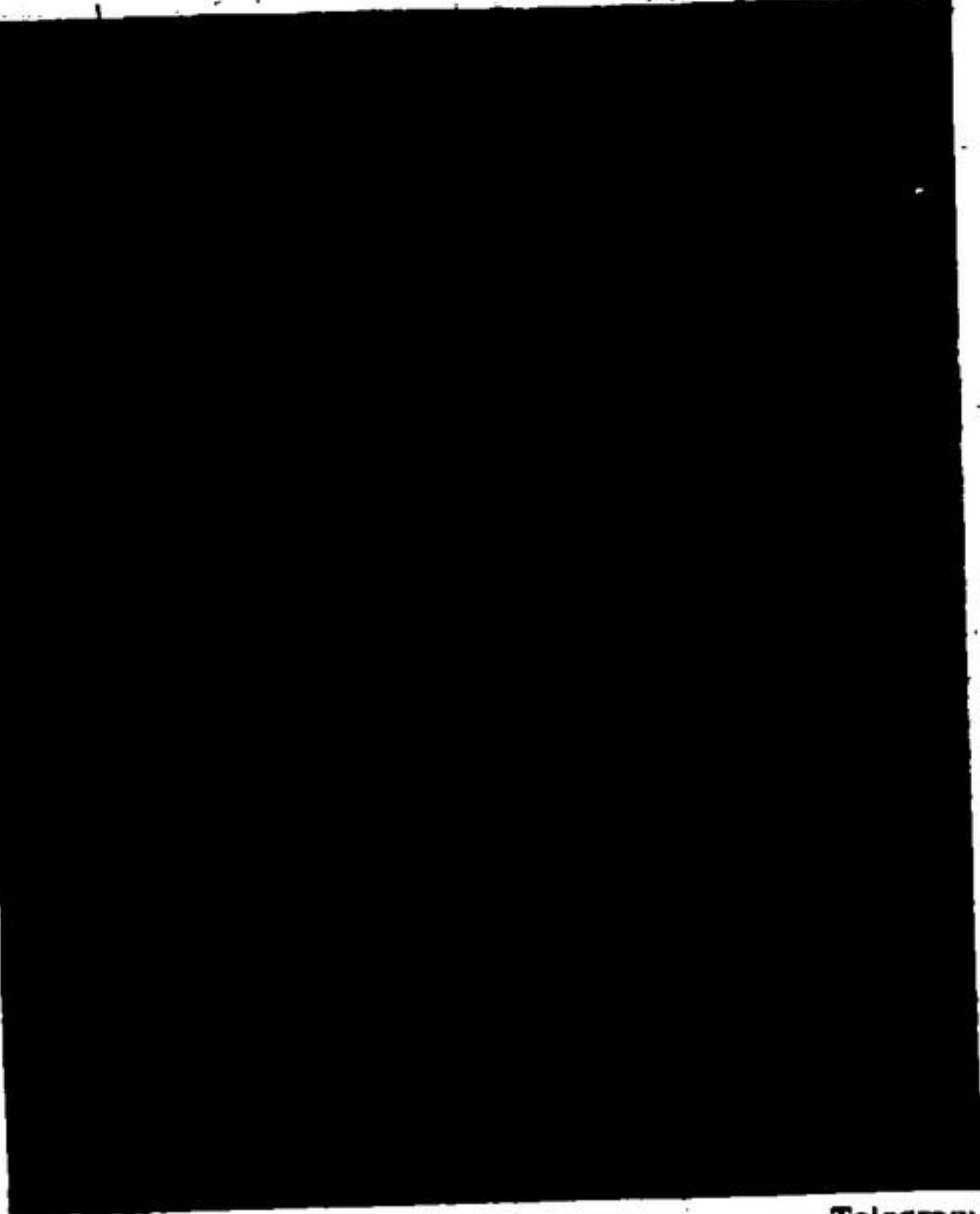


Capt. J. G. Mimms Welcomed Home

Dr. J.C. McCullough Buried in Greenwood

Dr. John Clark McCullough, 61, died at his home in New Liskeard, on April 25th after a lingering illness.

Son of the late Dr. John McCullough of Walters Falls, he lived on a farm near town with his uncle R. C. McCullough while he attended Georgetown High School, graduating from University of Toronto Medical School in 1916. He enlisted that year with the RCAMC, served in France with the Lord Strathcona Horse and was seriously wounded in 1918. He was awarded the Military Cross after Amiens.

After the war, he became associated with his brother, the late Dr. James S. McCullough in a medical practice in New Liskeard. He leaves his wife, three daughters, Sally in training at Toronto General Hospital, Nora and Elizabeth; and a brother, Harry of Orillia. Dr. U. A. McCullough, R. R. 1, Georgetown, is an uncle.

The funeral service was held in New Liskeard on Monday. Interment was made in the family plot in Greenwood Cemetery here the next day, Rev. Alex. J. Calder being in charge of a committal service.

Jersey Records Increase in Halton County

Halton County continues to show increased activity as the years go by in the Jersey breed. Probably there is no way this is shown more than in the increased number of records that are being completed monthly by Jersey cows in the county. In recent weeks, the high cow for this district has been Regal Queen Firefly owned by Maurice Beatty of Milton. Firefly as an eleven year old produced 13,124 lbs. of milk, 795 lbs. of fat in 365 days with a test of 6.06 per cent. In the same herd, Lindale Basil D. Flash produced as a five year old, 12,805 lbs. of milk, 719 lbs. of fat in 365 days. This cow is a daughter of Brampton Basil Ward, the famous bull which headed the Beatty herd for several years. Lindale Basil D. Gadyas at six years produced 10,222 lbs. of milk, 615 lbs. of fat in 305 days with a test of 6.02 per cent, qualifying for a Gold Medal Certificate. Five other outstanding records have been completed in this same period.

The Agricultural College, Guelph herd is led by College Volunteer Jacobine with an 8 year old record, of 12,738 lbs. of milk, 883 lbs. of fat in 365 days.

Seven cows have completed records in the herd of Featherstone Bros., of Oakville, led by Avonlea King's Solveig 2nd with a junior 4 year old record in 365 days of 10,622 lbs. of milk, 679 lbs. of fat. Avonlea Basil's Zana has completed a senior three year old record in 305 days of 9,284 lbs. of milk and 847 lbs. of fat. She is a daughter of the superior sire, Brampton Jersey Basil.

Records have also been completed in the herds of G. S. Matthews and Son, Acton, and in the herd of Kenneth L. Ella of Hornby where Rock Ella W. R. Lady produced 839 lbs. of fat in 305 days from a milk production of 8,282 lbs. The well-known producer Grove Farm Theresa Douc, owned by Mr. Ella, has completed another record as an eight year old in 305 days, of 11,264 lbs. of milk and 539 lbs. of fat.

One of the younger breeders in Halton County is Lloyd Crichton of Georgetown and a silver medal certificate goes to his cow Norval Volunteer's Belle which as a senior two year old in 305 days produced 8,240 lbs. of milk and 523 lbs. of fat.

"Our Inheritance" Sermon Subject at St. John's

At St. John's United Church on Sunday, Rev. John M. Smith conducted both services. In the morning he based his subject, "Our Inheritance" on the story of Naboth and his vineyard, particularly on Naboth's answer to King Ahab when he tried to get the vineyard from Naboth. "The Lord forbid it me that I should give the inheritance of my fathers unto thee," Naboth prized his inheritance, not just for its value, but because he knew what his forefathers had put into it of work and sacrifice, trusting always that it would be passed on from son to son. We have a good Christian inheritance, just as real, in our churches, even the buildings, but also the strong faith that belongs to them, wrought up by much labour and sacrifice, always in the hope that we would prize it, use it well, seek to improve it and pass it on to others. May we see our responsibility as Naboth saw his and meet any challenge to our inheritance in the spirit that Naboth met his.

The choir sang the anthem — "God sends the night". Mr. A. Tost sang a solo "I heard the voice of Jesus Say".

At the evening service "Gideon and his three hundred faithful men" was the subject, showing that because "Every man stood in his own place" and did what was required of him at the right time, God was able to give them the victory. Such is what God requires of us. Alex. McLaren accompanied the singing.

In Genesis, it reads "The Lord blessed the Egyptians house (an officer of Pharaoh) for Joseph's sake. The Lord can still bless the place where you labour, for your sake, because of your faithfulness to Him.
