**U.N. Relief Hospital in Taegu, Korea**

From the beginning of the conflict in Korea the United Nations has been doing the utmost to maintain the health of the civilian population in Taegu, for instance, despite lack of facilities a relief hospital was transformed into a relief hospital which has treated as many as 400 in-patients.
