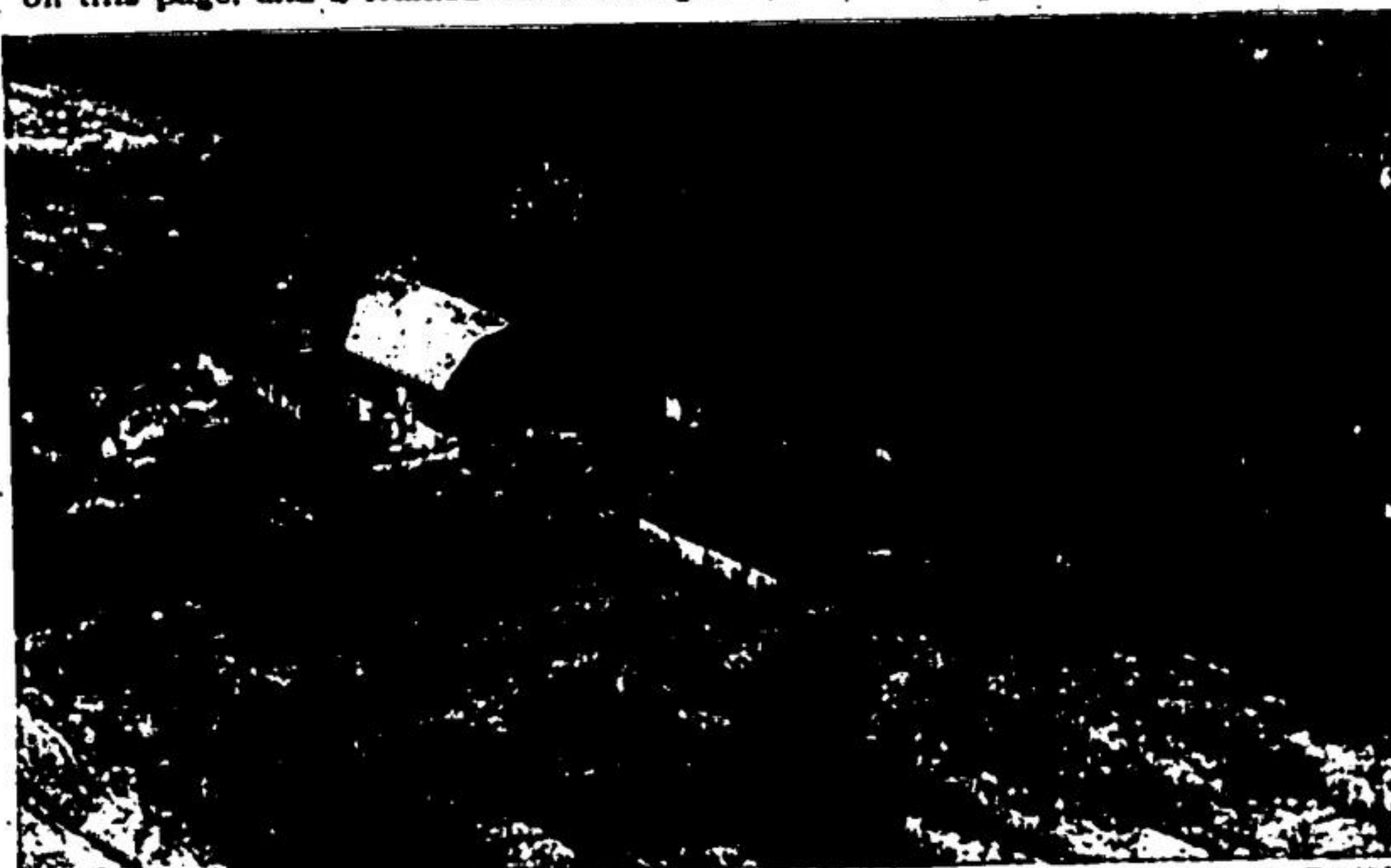

FARM NEWS

**HOLSTEINS SELL HIGH
AT OAKVILLE NATIONAL**

A \$905.00 average at a sale of dairy cattle is a lot of money in any day and age. Yet that is the reported figure for the 68 head of cattle sold at the National Holstein Sale held in the Municipal Arena, Oakville, on Monday of last week.

True, they were in our opinion a top lot of cattle brought out in excellent condition and bloom. It does indicate that despite the present surplus in most of our agricultural commodities, Holstein breeders have confidence that the market will correct itself just as soon as the present U.S. embargo is removed.

The top figure, \$6500.00, was paid for an 8 months old son of Markman out of a "Good Plus" dam sired by Montvic Chieftain 7th. This calf was purchased by Mr. Hope Farms in the U.S. which means he will have to remain at Glenaston Farms at Alliston until the embargo is lifted. Halton was well represented both in the buying and selling. F. Pellettario & Sons, of Milton, paid \$1275.00 for a junior yearling grandson of the \$15,200 Raymondale Yalta. Grand Rang Monarch Major is the name of this new Halton resident. His dam is a "very good" cow with a lifetime production of 167,534 lbs. of milk and 6,157 lbs. fat. Her largest and most recent record is made as an 11-year-old with 28,013 lbs. of milk and 828 lbs. of fat.

From this same herd, namely W. Bouquet of La Presentation, Que. W. S. Hall & Son, Oakville, purchased a senior yearling heifer at \$1250. Halton sellers included R. C. Given & Son, Georgetown, whose outstanding senior yearling heifer brought \$1100; 3-year-old heifer from A. G. Hunter, of Nelson, was sold at \$875; a two-year-old heifer

consigned by J. F. Trimble, President of the Halton Holstein Club brought \$550; from Frank G. Stark & Son, of Milton, a two-year-old daughter of Lonelm Texal Anthony (one of the Maple Unit sires) brought \$500; a similar figure was received by Dr. Paul Beer and Son, Georgetown, for their two-year-old daughter of Rockwood Rocket Julius; Blanshard Bros., of Burlington were the consignors of a good three-year-old heifer, but unfortunately we were not present when this heifer went through the ring. However, this should be sufficient to indicate that despite present conditions, good cattle still command high prices.

**BREEDERS' CLUBS

J. A. Carroll, Assistant Deputy Minister of Agriculture, is to be the guest speaker at the Twilight Meeting to be held at the Oakville Sales Arena, near Trafalgar, on Tuesday evening, June 3rd. This will be the fourth annual event of its kind sponsored by the Halton Holstein Breeders' Club. It will be recalled that Mr. Carroll acted, as manager of the two Ontario champion plowmen who toured Great Britain early this year. While overseas, Mr. Carroll visited a number of other European countries, and it goes without saying that his address entitled "Highlights of My Overseas Trip" will be of interest to all agricultural producers.

Along with this outstanding address will be some demonstrations and judging of Holsteins under the able leadership of George Drennan, popular fieldman for Central Western Ontario. Ladies as well as men are invited and with splendid accommodation under cover, the event will go on rain or shine.

**SUNDAY SERVICES AT
ST. JOHN'S UNITED**

On Sunday morning at St. John's United Church, Rev. John M. Smith took as his subject, "The Everlasting Gospel" and for his text, the prophecy of Isaiah, 2600 years ago, "The grass withereth, and the flowers fade, but the word of our God shall stand for ever." The scripture lesson told of Jesus in the synagogue, reading another portion of Isaiah's prophecy, made 700 years before, and then declaring that He, Jesus, had come in fulfillment of that prophecy. And now after more than 2600 years, after much persecution, and many attempts to burn it out and destroy it, God's word still stands, stronger than ever, and spread over most of the earth. This may not be proof that it will stand for ever, but it should be a reasonable assumption. But that is not all. We have learned that that which is based on truth is solid and enduring, and we believe that God's word is truth. And more and more we know that science and truth are coming closer together, coordinating their findings, to the strengthening of God's truth. Love is another factor; God's world is founded in love, and love is the strongest and most enduring force in our universe.

Further there is no ism or doctrine, however sincere, which carries such a fundamental message of peace and goodwill as does God's Gospel, something which strikes deep into our human nature, and reaches the heart of most people the world over, making for the permanence of that which gives them such a message. Surely, with all these forces in our favour, and our rich past experience, we are justified in accepting Isaiah's prophecy, Jesus' word that "My word shall not pass away" and John's dream on the Isle of Patmos, when "he saw an angel, having the everlasting gospel, to preach unto them that dwell on the earth, to every nation, kindred, tongue and people."

The choir's anthem was "The Lord is in His Holy Temple". Audrey and Joan Bishop sang very sweetly as a duet "Come Unto Me."

At the evening service, beautiful pictures of Biblical Customs were shown, and described by Mr. Smith.
