

**Mutual Aid Fire Test on Sunday**

Georgetown fire brigade joined in mutual aid demonstration throughout Halton on Sunday. The fire siren sounded shortly after 9 o'clock and Georgetown brigade sped to Milton, reaching there minutes after the alarm sounded. Meanwhile, a Trafalgar truck was alerted to protect Georgetown. The town was unprotected for 37 minutes while Trafalgar was enroute here. It was the first test of the new system which will provide better fire protection in the county. Halton has been organized along lines of the Toronto fire department so that no section is left unprotected while its brigade is fighting a fire. This is particularly beneficial to Georgetown which is one of the few towns which has only one fire truck.



**Brother Killed in Camp Borden Accident**

A tragic accident caused the death of a Georgetown woman's brother at Camp Borden on Sunday. Former artillery sergeant Elgin Moore, 33, of Lisle, was instantly killed when he attempted to unscrew the detonator of a live mortar shell on an artillery range. Mr. Moore and his wife had gone out earlier in the day to pick up scrap metal for salvage. Besides his wife, he is survived by his sister, Mrs. Thomas Leslie, Georgetown, and two brothers, Russell or Barrie and Elmer, New York.

**Midget Baseballers Lose First to Acton**

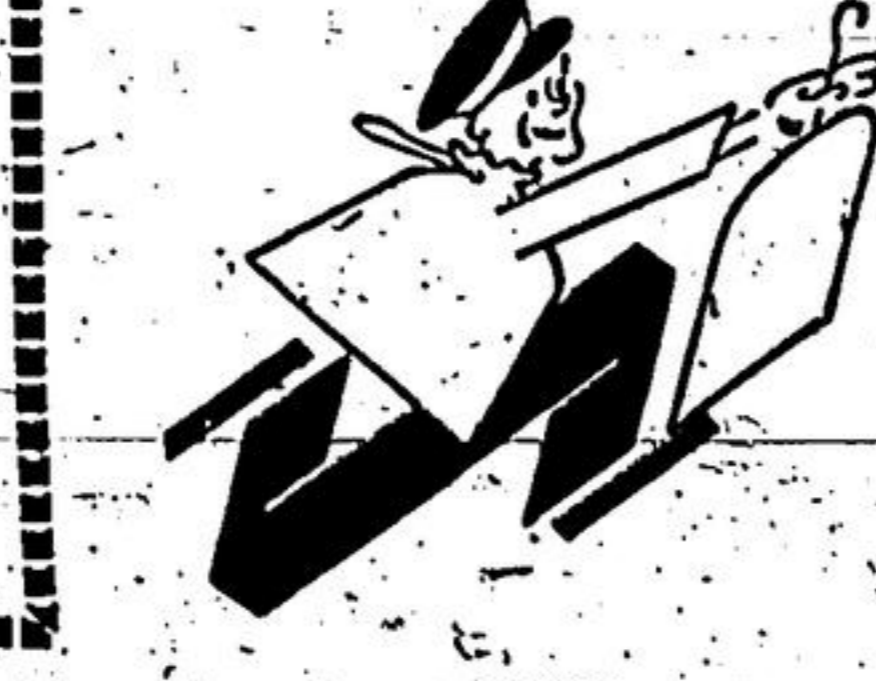
