**Attend Howson Reunion Saturday at Mount Hope**

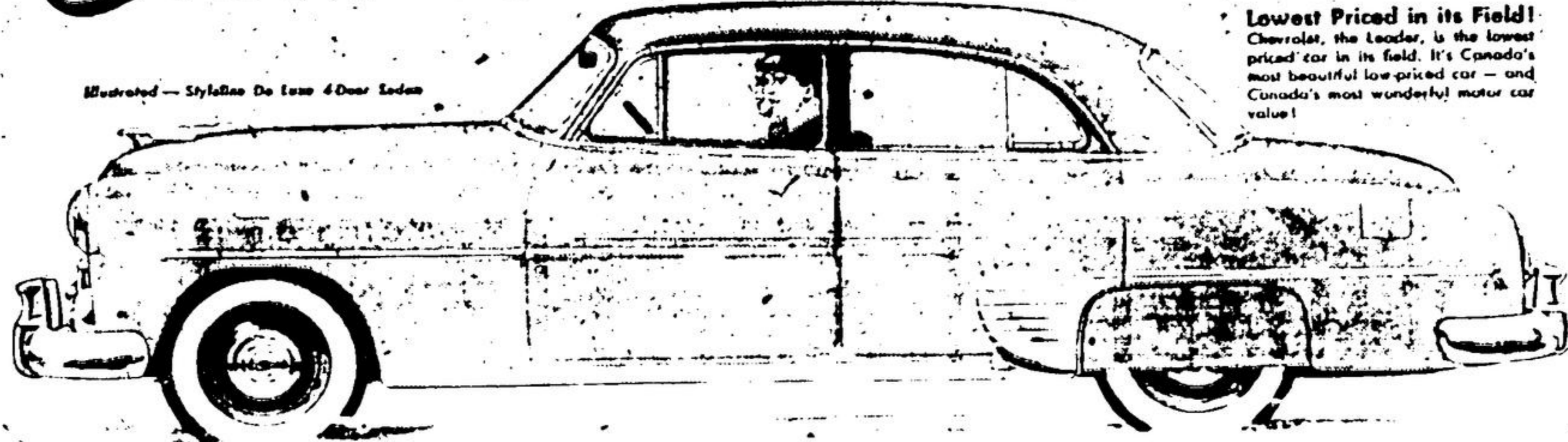
