

**AROUND THE HOME**  
A KNIFE BOX that offers both convenience and protection against sharp edges may be quite easily fashioned from a block of white pine — with strips along the sides — and end and bottom of the same material.  
First make cuts in the main block with a saw; then add sides, base and front end. Just as a guide to dimensions: a box to hold three paring knives and one kitchen or table knife should be about 4 ins. wide; 2 ins. deep, and 10 ins. long.
