

Evelyn Morphy Dies Suddenly in Toronto

Miss Evelyn Morphy died suddenly at the Wellesley Hospital, in Toronto, on June 18th. In poor health for some time, she had entered hospital for a check-up on the previous Saturday, but her death was unexpected.

She was the only daughter of Walter S. Morphy, K.C., for many years a lawyer in Brampton, and Clara Bell Morphy, whose home town was Georgetown. The family moved to Toronto several years ago and Mr. Morphy had been dead for a number of years. She was also predeceased by a brother in infancy. Her mother lives at 38 Northcliffe Blvd. in the city, where the funeral service was held on Friday, with interment afterward in Greenwood Cemetery here.
