



Fifty per cent of this amount is provided by the Halton County Council, an equal amount by the Ontario Department of Agriculture. The policy in question provides a subsidy of fifty percent of the cost up-to-a maximum of \$100 on any approved pond. If the first twenty applicants construct approved ponds each costing \$200 or more to construct, that will take the entire \$2000 available under the policy. At a recent meeting of the Halton Conservation Committee it was agreed however, that in the event the policy is continued in 1953, then those who do not qualify in the first awenty, will automatically go on the priority list for 1953. While Halton is the only county in the province to adopt a farm pond policy, several river valley authorities have launched similar

subsidized projects.

Open Air Service Held


