AROUND THE HOME

PROTECT THE GARDEN ROSE— by
hanging it up on shady side of
house after use so that it is thor-
oughly drained. All you need is a
small pulley under the eaves and a
rope used the same as on a
flag pole.

GOOD SUPPORTS for such flowers
as peonies and delphiniums may
easily be fashioned from stakes,
1-1/4 or 2-inch square, painted
green. Screw in hooks at one-foot
intervals to support wire loops or
wooden hoops.
