

Milton Fair Again Cattlemen's Mecca

While not quite as large as in 1951, the dairy show at Milton Fair was a tremendous show with a total of 329 head of Holsteins, Jerseys and Guernseys showing in their respective rings. Broken down into breeds, 78 Jerseys, 97 Guernseys and 158 Holsteins paraded for the respective judges, Bert McGrath of Valleyanna Farm, York County; Adam Calder, Glanford Station; and Hardy Shore, of Glanworth. Jas. Bremner, secretary of the Canadian Jersey Cattle Club, Bruce Hodgins, secretary and fieldman of the Ontario Guernsey Club, and George Drennan, fieldman for the Holstein-Friesian Association in West-Central Ontario, all assisted with the show, and in all cases they were delighted with the number and quality of the cattle shown in their chosen breed.

Jersey Show: Maurice C. Beatty won the prem-

ier exhibitor honours — also had the junior champion bull, with W. H. Devlin getting the reserve. In the aged bull class Gerald R. Graham had the senior and grand champion, with W. H. Devlin getting the reserve senior championship, and M. C. Beatty the reserve grand. In the female classes M. C. Beatty had the junior champion, and Ken Ella & Sons the reserve junior championship. In the seniors, M. C. Beatty was again to the fore with the senior female champion, and Ken Ella & Sons also had the reserve senior champion. These two animals were later made grand and reserve grand female champion of the show.

GUERNSEY SHOW
 In the Guernsey Show the T. Eaton Co. Special, emblematic of the premier, exhibitor award went to Joyce Bros. The same exhibitors took the Lazy Pat Farm Special for the top Graded Herd; the Milton Milling Trophy for the winning Junior Get of Sire; the Guernsey Club Special for the best uddered female; and the Halton Cooperative Supplies silver tray for the winning Junior herd.

M. T. McNabb & Sons won the premier award and with it the Bank of Montreal special. The same exhibitor had the winning senior get of sire and thereby won the L. and L. Farms Special. The other special donated by the Hayward Transport Co. Ltd. for the winning progeny of dam was won by E. E. Featherstone & Sons.

The junior championships for males was won by Wm. G. Booth with Joyce Bros. getting the reserve. The senior and grand champion male was shown by Joyce Bros. with Lazy Pat Farms getting the reserve senior, and Wm. G. Booth the reserve grand on his junior champion.

In the female section, Joyce Bros. had the junior champion and Lazy Pat Farms the reserve, while M. T. McNabb & Sons had the senior and grand champion female and Joyce Bros. the reserve senior and reserve grand.
