SPEAKER AT WMS**

A person may compete in one set only. The entry form must also state the name and address of the person to whom the cheque for prize money may be forwarded. All entries must be in the hands of the General Manager on or before October 10th, 1952. Entries will be accepted in the order in which they are received, up to the number which can be accommodated. Entry fee must accompany the entry form: for each junior set \$2.00; for each senior set \$4.00.

8. The winners of the Junior Division will be announced on November 19th, and of the Senior Division on Nov. 22nd. Prize money will be forwarded by cheque within a few days of the close of the Royal.

9. There will be ample accommodation for spectators to view the contest and no charge will be made other than the usual charge of 50c to gain admission to the fair.

10. The Royal will not be responsible for transportation to the fair, nor for maintenance while in Toronto.

**Square Dancing  
Competition at Royal**

1. The 1952 dates for the Royal are Friday, November 14th to Saturday, November 22nd. A contest for sets from anywhere in Canada or the USA, will be held on November 19th, 20th, 21st and 22nd.

2. Each set must consist of four ladies and 4 gentlemen.

3. There will be a Junior Division and a Senior Division. Those who by October 6th, 1952, have reached their 9th birthday and have not reached their 17th birthday are eligible for the Junior Division. All competing in the Senior Division must have reached their 17th birthday by October 10th, 1952.

4th. All sets will be called on to dance to the caller provided by the Royal such one of the following changes as the judges may select. In the case of the Junior division, the selection will be limited to one of the Nos. 1, 2 or 3 listed below. The particular form which these changes must take for this competition will be forwarded with the acknowledgement of the entry:

- 1 Dip and Dive; 2 Right Hand Up and Left Hand Under; 3 Forward Four in a Line; 4 Right and Left 4 and 8; 5 Cut off 8; 6 Birdie in the Cage; 7, Lady Round Two and the Gent Cut Through; 8 Lady Round Lady, Gent Also.

In addition, each set will be required to dance a change of its own choosing, in not over seven minutes, other than listed above, for which change the set must provide its own caller and bring with it four copies of its own written music. In the finals of the contest, in the event of a tie, sets may be called upon to dance a change other than those listed above.

5. The Royal will provide a competent caller, a skilled orchestra, and a panel of three competent and independent judges.
