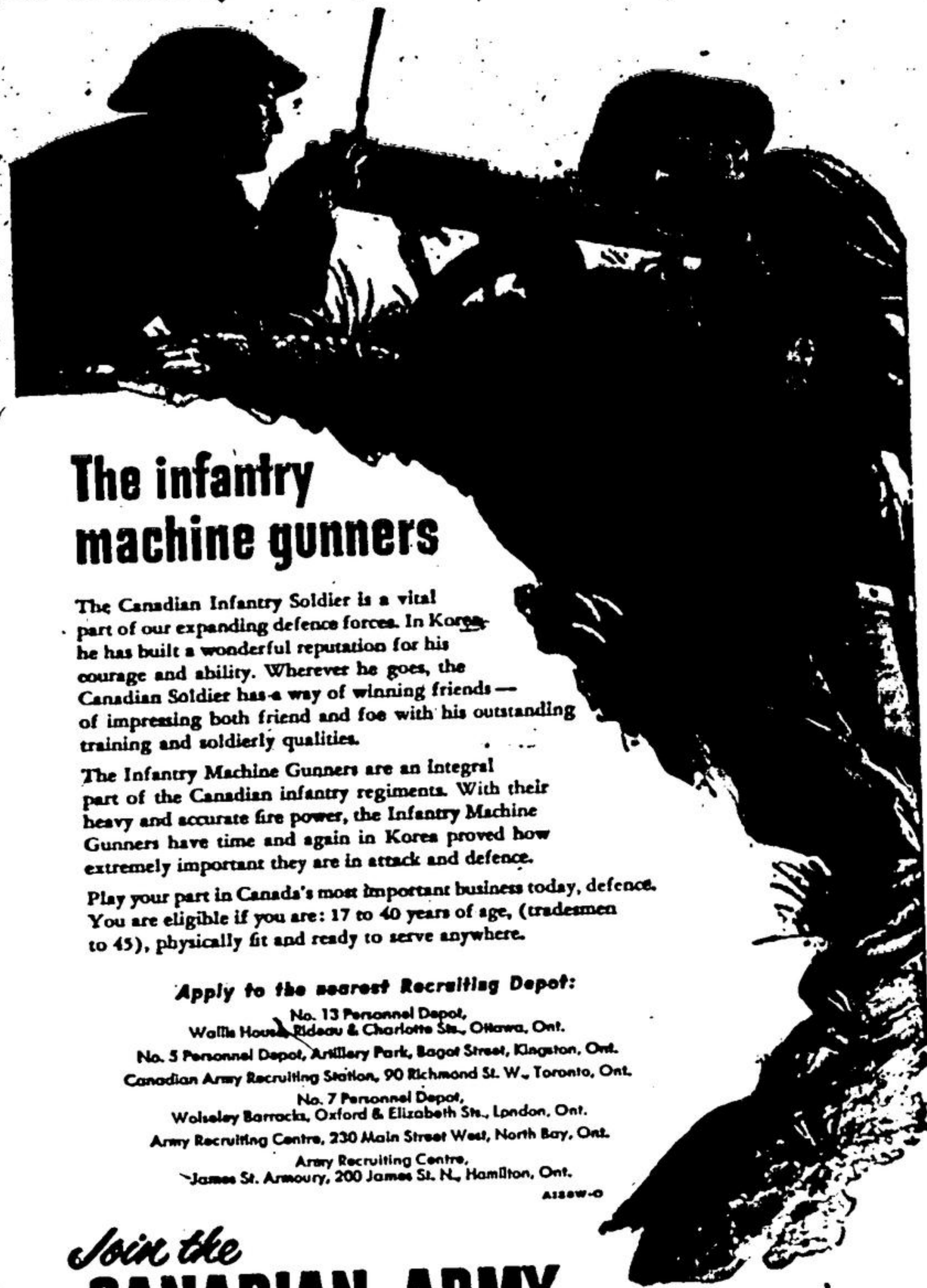

AT ESCUING COUNCIL

ON MONDAY, OCTOBER 8th

The first account for \$50 to Milton Fire Brigade under the new fire area system was paid. The brigade attended a fire at Sam Muddle's barn on June 15th.

Sheep claims totalled \$225.60. Teeter Bros., Lancaster, Kentucky, (Meldrum Stark, agent) lost 2 reg. lambs at \$35 each. Mr. Stark had a reg. sheep killed and 2 lambs injured for a total of \$76.80. Robert Irving, lamb killed, \$21; Dan Allan, 2 sheep killed, \$46. Valuator fees to A. N. Stark and Meldrum Stark were \$12.

Grants of \$125 each were paid to Acton and Georgetown fair boards and \$50 to Milton. A \$200 payment was made to Georgetown Fair for the building fund.

Fox claims of \$5 each for foxes destroyed were paid to Ernie Miller and Ernest Curry, Georgetown, W. J. Cox, Milton and James Steele, Acton.

The road superintendent was instructed to advertise for tenders for snow plowing.

The clerk was instructed to prepare a by-law setting the time of the township nomination and election to an earlier date.

Accounts included: Roads \$15,120; Relief, \$133.

At the September meeting, the township petitioned for the grant of Highways for the statutory grant on \$33,679 road expenditures from the first of the year to end of August. The clerk was instructed to prepare a by-law to appoint a cemetery board.

FEEDERS WHO KEEP RECORDS EVENTUALLY BUY MASTER

REGISTER DISPERSAL AVERAGE \$315 AT

The dispersal sale of the pure-bred Holstein herd of Frank L. Rogister & Son, Milton, Ont. held Oct. 2nd at Oakville realized a total of \$8,520 on 29 head for a general average of \$315.

The top price of the sale was \$660 paid by A. O. Elliott, Exeter, for the seven year old cow Homey Emily Dewdrop Rag Apple. Mr. Elliott also bought the second top animal, a four year old at \$520. W. G. Barchard, Newcastle paid \$410 for a milking female. It is interesting to note that the ten top females averaged \$412.

Other good prices included \$420 paid by C. McDowell, Hornby, for a milking female; \$360 paid by W. D. Fraser, Streetsville for a milking female; \$375 paid by Wm. J. Craig, Brampton, for a bred heifer; \$350 paid by Stephen Dinga, St. Anns, for a milking female; \$355 paid by Ashville Farms Ltd., Palermo for a milking female.

Sixteen milking females averaged \$350, one bred heifer \$375, 8 open heifers \$253, one heifer calf \$330 and one bull \$200. The \$330 heifer calf was also purchased by A. O. Elliott.
