ROGISTER DISPERSAL AVERAGE \$315 AT

The dispersal sale of the purebred Holstein herd of Frank L. Rogister & Son, Milton, Ont. held Oct. 2nd at Oakville realized a total of \$8,520 on 29 head for a general av-

erage of \$315. The top price of the sale was \$660 paid by A. O. Elliott, Excter, for the seven year old cow Homey Emily Dewdrop Rag Apple. Mr. Elliott also bought the second top animal, a four year old at \$520. W. G. Barchard, Newcastle paid \$410 for a milking female. It is interesting to note that the ten top fe-

males averaged \$412. Other good prices included \$420 paid by C. McDowell, Hornby, for a milking female; \$360 paid by W. D. Fraser, Streetsville for a milking female; \$375 paid by Wm. J. Craig, Brampton, for a bred helfer; \$350 paid by Stephen Dinga, St. Anns, for a milking female; \$355 paid by Ashville Farms Ltd., Palermo for a milking female.

Sixteen milking females averaged \$350, one bred helfer \$375, 8 open heifers \$253, one helfer calf \$330 and one bull \$200. The \$330 helfer calf was also purchased by A. O.
