**Rev. Collin Todd Back  
St. John's Anniversary**

At St. John's United Church on Sunday, both morning and evening services were in celebration of the 113th anniversary of the founding of the church in this community. It is a far cry back to 1839 and the saddle horse days of the itinerating preacher, travelling over a wide sparsely settled area, meeting with a small group of Christian people, probably in one of their homes, or the small school house, upholding and encouraging them in their Christian faith, accepting of their hospitality for a few days, then travelling on to help another group, all very reminiscent of the days of the disciples of old and of Paul and others, all full of zeal for the spreading of the gospel. Then would come the desire for a place of worship, and the willingness to sacrifice and a mind to work for such. Thus would St. John's be built as a Methodist chapel, one of a number on a circuit, until in the union of 1925 it became part of the United Church of Canada, and as it grew, became a charge of itself, later to be named St. John's United Church.

Down through all these years there has been a long succession of faithful, earnest ministers, with many faithful followers, upholding and adding to the church. The most recent of these, the Rev. R. Collin Todd, B.A., B.D., now of Kitchener Street United Church Niagara Falls, was the guest speaker for both services, and was welcomed and introduced by Rev. John M. Smith, the present pastor. Mr. Todd expressed great pleasure at this opportunity of returning to his former church and pulpit, congratulated the congregation and Mr. Smith on the continued growth and achievements of the church, and wished them much success in all future endeavours. He had intended speaking on "Counting the Cost" but after learning more during the week of the splendid growth of the Sunday School and the faithful work of its teachers and officers, he decided to pay tribute to the work of the ordinary Christians, and to encourage them in this sacrificial task. His Scripture Lesson was from Luke 14, 13-25, Jesus' parable of the great supper to which the ordinary and lowly people were invited, followed by Jesus teaching that only those who bear His Cross, can be His disciples. His text was taken from Revelation 14, "Lo, a Lamb stood on Mount Zion, and with Him, one hundred and forty and four thousand, having His father's name written on their foreheads, and they sang as it were a new song, before the throne, and no man could learn that song but the One Hundred and Forty-Four Thousand which were redeemed from the earth." An eternal number of ordinary people who gave themselves to God's redeeming service, sacrificing of their time, talent and possessions, so that others could learn to know of Jesus as their Saviour and God as their loving Heavenly Father. True the disciples would be among them, they who bravely started the "going out" to tell others; and so would leaders and great thinkers who were able to give direction and reformation to the work, but most would be ordinary faithful followers, believers and workers, willing to give and do much, that God's work might go forward. He mentioned the United Nations as being needed, with its high ideals of world peace and brotherhood; needed to plan and persuade men into ways and means to attain that end, but it could only be accomplished when the ordinary Christians of the world put their whole weight behind the teachings of Jesus, and saw to it that they became practice the world over. It could only be then that God's blessing of love, peace and goodwill, would rule and direct our world, God's world, and our highest ideals, and His wish and will be fulfilled.

The Senior Choir sang "King All Glorious" with Mrs. Kidney and Mrs. Wrigglesworth taking the solo parts. The Junior Choir sang "All in an April Evening" while the Carmen Quartette, from Toronto, Mr. and Mrs. J. Norris and Mr. and Mrs. J. Millner, sang "Eternal Light" and assisted in the worship of praise.

Mr. Norman Laird was given appreciative thanks for his leadership of both choirs, and for the splendid assistance he had brought from the

Young Adult group of Carmen United Church. Among many from out of town who were present, were elderly Mr. and Mrs. Charles Williams who had driven themselves that morning from the Simcoe district to be present, Mr. Williams remarking that he sang in this choir sixty years ago.

A full congregation again greeted Mr. Todd in the evening, with many from the Baptist and Presbyterian Churches joining in the worship. Mr. Todd spoke from the text Matt. 8:20 "The foxes have holes, and the birds of the air have nests, but the Son of man hath not where to lay His head." This was the answer of Jesus to a scribe who said: "Master, I will follow Thee whithersoever Thou goest." Jesus' answer implied "Have you counted the cost." Then to another who had asked to be allowed to first bury his father, Jesus had answered: "Follow me, and let the dead bury the dead." Truly a harsh saying, yet Jesus did not mean that such things were not right and proper, but rather that even such things must not hold back or hinder the progress of the Kingdom of God, that even the decency and courtesy of burying the dead, must give place to the real needs, spiritually particularly, of the living. Hard sayings, Jesus admitted, with man almost impossible to obey, but "with God all things are possible." Many of us, said Mr. Todd, are following Jesus, but following a long way behind, so these sayings are harsh sayings and it is only when the Spirit has taught us that we must be ready if needs be, to leave all at any time and follow Jesus closely, that we can realize the full and true peace and happiness which comes, which God gives, with full obedience and surrender. He made a strong appeal to any present who had not yet yielded to the "Follow Me" of Jesus, and to those who were following far behind, to close the gap, and give themselves to the close following which Jesus seeks of us.

The worship of praise was full and from the heart and was added to greatly by the Senior choir with their anthem "Great and Marvelous" by Turner, the beautiful trio rendering of "Prayer Perfect," the trio being Fern Caird, Myrtle Norris and Rene Millner, all of Carmen Young Adults, and sweet rendering of the Chorale by Bach "Flocks in pastures green abiding," by the Junior Choir.

**George Leck Speaker  
Sunday School Rally**

George Leck, minister of Ashgrove Charge of the United Church was speaker at a rally of Sunday Schools of Hallowell Presbytery held in St. Paul's Church, Milton on October 12th.

Mr. Leck, an RCAF veteran who is taking his last year theological course in Toronto, gave a thoughtful address on "Building for God" telling Sunday School leaders the necessity for steady, constructive effort in their work.


