Town, Township Plan Civic Election Soon

Both Georgetown and Esqueping will have changes this year in nomination dates for civic elections. Esqueping, which up until this year has had voting day on the first Monday in the new year, has advanced the date to the first Monday in December. Nomination meeting which was formerly an afternoon affair, will this year be held on Friday evening, November 21st in the township hall at Stewarttown. Nominations this year call for a reeve, deputy reeve, three councillors and two members of the township School Area No. 10. Georgetown's election date remains the same, the second Monday in December, but there has been a change in date of the nomination meeting. For two years this has been held on the preceding Monday. This year council has decided to put this date back a few days, to the second Thursday preceding elections, which this year makes it Thursday, November 27. At this time nominations are asked for mayor, reeve, deputy reeve, six councillors and one hydro commissioner elected by general vote, and one member from each of three wards for school board.

FARM NEWS

Drought Proves Value Farm Ponds in Halton

The continued drought has created a serious water shortage problem on many farms in south Halton. This factor together with the Halton Farm Pond Policy has stimulated renewed interest in farm ponds. Since the policy was announced last March a total of sixty two applications have been received at the Milton office of the Ontario Department of Agriculture. The members of the Halton County Council committee on Agriculture and Reforestation on Friday visited nine of the farm ponds which have been constructed in the county in recent months. They also made an inspection tour of county Reforestation Plots. The committee was more than satisfied at the pond sites visited and realized as they never did before just how important a good farm pond can be in certain areas of the county.

FALL SOIL SAMPLES URGED FOR FARMERS

Halton farmers who intend to plant spring grains and wish to have their soil analyzed before planting, would be well advised to take their soil samples before freeze up. In former years too many Ontario farmers have waited until spring to take their samples. Such a procedure has resulted in the Soils Department at the Ontario Agricultural College being deluged with samples in the spring. In the final analysis the reports quite frequently are too late to act as a guide for the current crop. Soil boxes and instructions for taking soil samples can be obtained from the Milton office of the Ontario Department of Agriculture.
