learned to control nature but no one has learned to control mankind. Scientists are the most fearful of all people today. Quoting General MacArthur, "We have had our last chance, not by alliances and treaties or by wars or revelations but by the Spirit." We must be filled with a spirit and zeal that will surpass that of the Communists. They have missionaries in all countries earnest and zealous ready to lay down their lives for their way of life, where we are barely holding our own. Many of our mission fields are understaffed simply for the lack of funds to send more out. Christianity says there is meaning to life. "We come from God — we go to God." Therefore Christ is a necessity, not a convenience.

This zeal and spirit must also be born of the belief in the beauty and possibility of Christ's kingdom. He would hardly have taught us in the Lord's Prayer "Thy Will Be Done on Earth" if it was not a possibility. We must believe it is possible and trust in God to do His part.

One of the German students at college told of attending a student rally in Germany where a young man was speaking for the Communist party. Someone in the audience spoke up and asked him what he thought about Christianity. He replied "I believe Christianity has the answer. It could defeat Communism... but Christians are too lazy, selfish and indifferent."

Can we deny it? Can we deny that indifference and selfishness are the two major sins of Christian people today?

**LADIES IN POLITICS?
FORUMS SAY "YES"**

Are women suited to politics?

This question, asked on last week's farm forum broadcast brought a variety of opinion in Halton forums.

Limestone said women are suited to politics but should enter as the equal of men and not expect concessions on account of their sex. Bannockburn forum was of contrary opinion and believes women are not suited for the role, though by taking leadership courses and with office experience they can be prepared for provincial and national offices.

Mt. Nemo and Ligny pointed out successful career women — Queen Elizabeth, Ellen Fairclough, M.P., Agnes McPhail, Charlotte Whittton and Halton's Sybil Bennett, as examples.

Only one forum objected to women in public life and said women who are active in community work are neglecting their home making. (Wonder if it was a stag party?) Major opinion was that women need a diversion from everyday toil and that community activities broadens the outlook and gives more enthusiasm for homemaking.
